Message from Chairman of QESOSA and QESOSAEPO

Dear Fellow Old Students,

2014 marks the 60th anniversary of Queen Elizabeth School. Founded in 1954, QES is dedicated to providing all-round education to students, where emphasis is placed on learning through a magnitude of extra-curricular activities. Old students of the 6 decades not only strive to excel in their career, but also commit themselves to serving society in different capacities.

Some 20 years ago, a group of old students embarked on practising the school motto and spreading the light of QES by providing quality education to the community. Since then, they established 2 primary schools and 2 secondary schools in Tin Sui Wai. The 4 schools have become popular in the community enjoying good reputation.

To ensure that the quality of the schools is sustainable, EPO has been focusing its effort on enhancing teaching effectiveness and the articulation of curriculum in the past few years. A professional development team was formed 2 years ago for this purpose. As a result of the hard work of the team and the proactive participation of the schools, not only have teachers largely enhanced their professional competence, but more importantly they have also extended their school-based learning community to a cross-school level.

Old students are thankful to QES for their rich and memorable secondary school life. In order to express our gratitude to our alma



mater, OSA has prepared a series of events to celebrate this 60th anniversary milestone of QES. We started the preparation work for QES60 in late 2012 together with QES and QES Parents-Teachers' Association, and our work came to a full swing in 2014.

The anniversary celebration will be kick-started by the Mosaic Wall Unveiling Ceremony at QES on 23 September 2014. Celebration activities will last throughout the school year with the QES variety show in July 2015 as the grand finale.

A series of sports events are being organized by OSA for QES60. Besides the annual Ball Games Tournaments, there will be a Golf Tournament on 28 November 2014. A QES60 team will be formed to join the Standard Chartered Marathon in 2015. Message from QES Principal

Encounters of the Third Kind – School Camp

Hidden in the eastern corner of the New Territories is the site of the QES School Camp. For decades, this unique home of QES became the training ground for generations of QES students, who all cherished the unique experience in life-wide learning. They were proud of every path leveled, every plant grown, and every structure built from scratch. Looking after themselves at a venue with only the most basic facilities, from preparing meals and washing to litter treatment, they learned a lot about being independent. Not only did they learn to be self-regulating, but also help each other along as they faced the challenges of nature. The tons of hardship were overcome by heart and sweat; even pains became laughter and sweet memories. There they put into practice the school motto: Vos Parate Ut Serviatis.

That is what I wrote for the School Camp 50th Anniversary Magazine only weeks after I presided at QES two years ago. As I look back, my personal experience of all events and encounters with people related to the School Camp only reinforce my observation at that time. The School Camp has had long-lasting impact on the souls of those who have devoted a large part of their school life to working and playing with their peers there. Strongly tied to this second home of theirs in their teenage years, old wardens of various generations are eager to share their joy and knowledge with their younger brothers and sisters now at school. A few of them have dedicated countless hours and massive effort to the maintenance of the venue and support for its healthy development. All the others devoted their heart. But then the uniqueness of the camp in terms of its management practices and warden training is not without shortcomings. Being the only school camp in the territory, without an employed manager, and with the established culture of the student wardens taking charge of all the training programmes of the juniors, the burden on the school staff concerned is immense, and the occurrence of some discrepancies and missing links is inevitable. But there is a good reason for the warden training system to work for over five decades. This is how the wardens develop their strong sense of belonging, high self-esteem, and intense team spirit. Through these years, various special skills were added to be necessary components of the training, but at the same time obsolete knowledge was retained and passed on as 'tradition'. Last summer, an accident leading to bodily injury of two wardens-in-training happened. It marked the beginning of a long battle: the injured students against their physical and psychological distresses, and that between the School Camp and the threats to its decades-long educational role. It is the congenital responsibility of the school to help the victims of the unfortunate incident to recover and return to their normal school life, as well as to take care of the psychological needs of all teachers and students involved. Along with special learning support arrangements from teachers and peers for the injured, psychological guidance and counseling by experts, review of safety and training programmes, and improvement works on the School Camp facilities were carried out promptly as planned. Committees and working groups were set up for investigation and camp improvement purposes. Thanks to the concerted efforts of some old wardens, teachers, parents and student wardens, camping and warden training activities resumed in less than five months last winter.

As the school head, I share the vision of the School Camp founders and Dr. Arthur Hinton for its educational value. It is our unique outdoor learning venue – for relevant extra-curricular activities and subject learning, a training ground for student leaders to develop their personality and sense of responsibility, and above all, a place to put into practice the school motto, for the camp wardens to serve the school and other students. But the societal changes and reforms in education over the years have widened the gap between the founders' vision and the stakeholders' expectations. There has also been growing demand for students' learning experience in diverse fields, and their safety and well-being must be of paramount importance. By this token, the School Camp facilities have to be modernized for its amenity and functional values to be enhanced. This would lay the ground for increasing the participation by different parties of the school – ECA leaders, prefects, uniform teams (Red Cross, Scouts and Guides), interest clubs, the PTA, the OSA and many others. To do so not only the existing facilities

need to be upgraded, but also professional instructors (e.g. for physical training, fire and electricity safety awareness enhancement, adventure-based counseling, first-aid and AYP training, and use of mechanical and power tools) need to be employed in the training and / or assessment of the warden trainees. In the long run, some trainees may acquire the professional qualification necessary to share part of the training and supervise the related activities. In view of the extensive area of the campsite, in addition to the exacting requirement for skill and labour to keep the environment at an acceptable level



for campers, employing a caretaker or manager to ensure basic amenity and perform essential maintenance is a possible way out. The student wardens will be left with some low-risk construction, maintenance, cleansing and creative tasks in a designated area of the camp to sustain their ownership. They would be in charge of all activities except those requiring professional personnel.

This academic year, the school is looking into all means for improvement of the safety condition, warden training and assessment routines, and camp facilities. We are delighted to see the old wardens working closer than ever with teacher advisors and student wardens. The support of parents and alumni and the consensus of stakeholders at the goal and direction of School Camp development are all indispensable. On the other hand, there were unsubstantiated complaints and spread of unverified information detrimental to the prestige of the School Camp from some unidentified sources. Moreover, there were grievances from some stakeholders who favoured swift and drastic changes and disapproved of the step-by-step approach presently adopted by the school. With a clear vision and goal for School Camp development on the one hand, the school is considerate of the difficulties, burdens and feelings of teachers and students on the other. In view of the unfortunate incident last summer, we need extra courage and thoughtfulness to review the camp rules and training programmes to achieve the educational objectives, but must be prudent and cautious to avoid jeopardizing the future of the School Camp. The school's determination and competence in this respect is unequivocal, and any mistrust or dissonance between stakeholders would pose hurdles on all the plans. We look forward to solving problems encountered through discussions and collaborations to build up mutual understanding and synergize efforts made by the school, teachers, parents, students and old wardens. Only by doing so could we warrant a splendid future of the School Camp.

School Camp activities are but part of our mission this year to promote 'Learning outside the confines of the classroom'. Students have been taking a more active part in learning activities both inside and outside the classroom. Web-learning, excursions, educational visits and student exchange programmes were encouraged to widen their horizons and perspectives. Students benefited from their first-hand learning experience and sharing with counterparts from other schools – Tsuen Wan Government Secondary School, True Light Girls' College and QESOSA Secondary School. Under the leadership of warm-hearted teachers, trips with various objectives were organized to places outside the territory. Students visited the cultural heritage of Macao, universities in Taiwan, our sister school at Ningbo, and made new friends in the visits to Korea, Singapore and Beijing. Locally, our students took part and obtained outstanding results in territory-wide competitions and different activities of music, speech, debating, maths and science, chess, and sports. For international competitions, some went as far as to South Africa for an international maths contest. It is part of the self-directed learning approach that helps unleash students' extra-curricular potentials in addition to their striving for academic excellence.

The closing of the school year marks the beginning of the celebrations for our 60th anniversary. May I appeal to all alumni to join hands with the school to cherish our glorious past, celebrate our present achievements, and chart the best for our future generations.





What a wonderful gathering! More than thirty QES old students had a joyful gettogether with family and friends.

The panel discussion on Housing Market and Condo Living was enthusiastically received. Daniel Chow started out with his talk on downsizing, which he jokingly distinguished from downgrading. His view was that it could be an opportunity for generating fruitful investment income.



Theresa and Jason Leung enlightened us with the many different lifestyle choices for retirement living, and gave us some helpful tips on fees, which may sometimes be unexpected, as well as tax breaks, which are perfectly legal.

James S.K. Tang gave us some pointers to look for in a property management company. He highlighted the prevalence of kickbacks and conflicts of interests in the procurement of condo services, and stressed the importance of active participation in condo management as a means to minimize this shortcoming.

A lively Q&A session followed, covering a range of topics such as the reasonability of condo fees, the need to look at the condo books to identify shortfalls and impending capital expenditures, pros and cons of an auction-type of property sale, etc.

QESOSA (Ontario) Scholarships at a Glance

QESOSA Ontario Ut Serviatis Scholarship (set up in 2001*)

Each year, a HKD\$500 scholarship is awarded to an outstanding student at each of the two OSA primary schools.

QESOSA Ontario Dr. Hinton Scholarship (set up in 2009)

Each year, two HKD\$800 scholarships are awarded to two outstanding students at each of the two OSA secondary schools - QESOSA Secondary School and QESOSA Tong Kwok Wah Secondary School.

Mr. Cheung Poon Scholarship (set up in 2013)

Starting in November 2014, five HKD\$800 scholarships will be awarded to five students who excel in the Chinese subject or related activities at QES each year. One student from each form (S1 to S5, previously known as F1 – F5) will receive the scholarship.

^{*} The precursor to the Ut Serviatis scholarship was a set of book prizes awarded each year, since 1992, to students at the OSA primary schools.

Reflections on Reciprocity

The main goal of our mentorship program is to broaden the horizon of our youngsters in the QES family of schools, providing them with an opportunity to learn more about the world outside of HK, and, hopefully, improving their English skills at the same time.

Flash back to 45 years ago: I was a student growing up in HK and attending QES, where I joined the Pen Pal Club. I was fortunate enough to have a pen pal from Sacramento, California, USA, and another one from France. I fondly remember the letters I received from them. They told me about their lives in their parts of the world and I was fascinated by it. I always loved the city of Sacramento even though I did not know anything about it at the time, just because I had a "friend" living there. Back then the world was big to me ... there was no computer, no internet, no emails, no Skype. I was very excited every time I received a snail mail from one of them. I remember bragging to my friends about having foreign friends from two different continents. Our communications, though short-lived, had created a huge impression on me.

So then, I did benefit from having pen pals when I was young. Surely now, I could benefit from being a mentor too. You see, I have been away from HK for over 40 years, and have never been back to visit. HK is now largely foreign to me. What I know is that things have changed tremendously since I left: new government, new subway, new airport and new residential areas that I do not think existed when I was living there. I feel so ignorant about so many things there. I thought, by being a mentor to a student, I might learn more about HK and its latest happenings from a personal perspective, not just from some Google articles.

My mentee is a student from QESOSA Tong Kwok Wah Secondary School. We started off very well by sending each other emails. She seems to be a very active, intelligent girl who cares very much about her family and their well-being. She wants to succeed and she appears to be willing to try hard. She belongs to South House, which is something we have in common. I also learned that although the HK education system has improved somewhat, it is still a "Pressure Cooker" examination system which exerts tremendous stress on the students.

I was able to tell her about my world, which she found very interesting. We exchanged photos as well. I sent slide pictures of some famous Canadian scenery and I believe she found them fascinating.

I trust that, by being her mentor, it has helped widen her view of the world. She also has an opportunity to write in English to someone who is not involved with her school work. That way, she can express herself in a relaxed manner and at the same time improve her English writing skills.

I am glad that I am part of the mentorship program. I feel very honoured to be a mentor and I hope we both gained something from this experience.

QESOSA EPO has set up a scholarship (家長互助互學獎勵計劃) for EPO school parents to encourage them to set a role model for their children in life long learning. Parents who enroll in and complete the CBMP courses will receive the scholarship. This year, 21 participants were awarded the scholarship amounting to \$4,200. Since the introduction of the programme, 387 participants have been awarded the scholarship with a cumulated amount of \$77,400.

The 10th Graduation Ceremony for CBMP held on, 9 June 2014 at Academy Community Hall. This year, our CBMP course tutor Mr. Tsoi Heung Sang received the "Outstanding Instructor Award" and Ms. Chan Lok Chi, a parent of EPO Schools, received the "Outstanding Student Award". For the Certificate of CBMP, 1 parent of EPO schools received Certificate Level 5, 7 parents of EPO schools received Certificate Level 2 and 1 parent of EPO schools received Certificate Level 1.

Elder Academy

The QESOSA Education Centre Elder Academy was established in 2007 with the support of QESOSA Secondary School (QOS). Teachers, students and parents of QOS as well as volunteers and staff from social service agencies participated actively to make the Elder Academy a success. The Elder Academy offered a total of 7 courses in the year 2013-2014, with over 137 elders enrolling in the programme.

A survey was conducted after each semester to collect feedback from elders on the courses offered. For the last two semesters, the elders highly rated the programme, particularly, the performance of the instructors and the overall logistics of the programme.

In the past year, 6 elders received the Silver Certificate (over 30 learning hours) and 11 elders received the Bronze Certificate (over 20 learning hours) awarded by the Elderly Commission.

前言

學校步入「三年學校發展周期」的第二年,總結去年經驗,學校在本年度主要為去年的各種校務進行檢討及反思,並作出優化,從不同層面檢視各種校務的情況,貫徹「修己善群」的辦學理念,在辦學質素方面精益求精。以下是本年度的校務報告:

一條龍銜接

本會的中小學一條龍政策自2011年9月正式落實,一條龍政策已邁進第四年,行政架構及運作模式已日益完善,一條龍督導委員會除了定期開會制訂有關政策、措施和程序外,亦全面監察和支援有關政策、措施

和程序的進展。在全體同工共同努力之下,一條龍政策得到家長和同學的支持。本年度有約75%的畢業學生選擇直接升讀兩所屬會中學,數據具體地展現了各持分者對本會一條龍政策的信任及肯定。我們相信,一條龍政策能為學生提供一貫十二年的全人教育,並能保持學校辦學理念、課程及培育方面的銜接和一致性,亦為學生提供一個穩定、正面積極的學習環境。

由伊中中學生帶領我們參觀香港濕地公園考

學校因應一條龍政策,與兩所屬會中學共同合作,為新生提供一連串的暑期銜接課程及活動,及早加強對學生的瞭解,亦能對個別學生及時作出適切的學習支援。

在課程銜接方面,本年度學校配合辦學團體,與屬會中學進行一連串的觀課活動,觀課對象重點為小學六年級至中學一年級的學生。觀課活動旨在讓中小學教師深入了解中小學課程之間的銜接,並運用蓋聶教學理論中的九個學習事件進行議課,統一專業交流的教學構架及專業術語。觀課活動對教師有莫大裨益,教師在議課時專業、坦誠,本校基於與屬會中學一條龍的優勢,教學質素得以提升。

學與教

學與教是學校的首要任務,是學校最基本、最核心的工作,因此亦是學校長期 的核心發展項目。在課程方面,學校近年積極進行課程發展和改革的工作,為了進

一步發揮小班教學的優勢及統一各班的教學效能,學校採用了合作學習及九個教學事件的教學方法,並透過各種觀課、集體備課、校內和校外的教學分享及交流活動,提升教師的教學策略及教學能量,從而提升教與學的質素。

配合本年度的關注事項「提升學生的學習動機及建立積極的學習態度」,學校落實了一系列的校務。在「提升學生的學習動機方面」,我們相信,學生的學習動機源於投入感及成就感,所以學校優化了「班本榮譽榜」及「成績龍虎榜」,令學生得到更多被表揚的機會,從被肯定中得到成就感,進而更積極學習。各班亦設有「一人一展示」,讓每位學生都得到展示學習成果的均等機會,更主動地展露才華。在「建立積極的學習態度」方面,各學科均重點發展學生預習及課後研習的能力,例如中文科的「預習簿」、常識科的專題研習等,學校更鼓勵學生多運用網上學習平台,例如有系統地進行BCA網上評估,學生的學習機會從課室擴展至各個層面。

在培養學生的反思能力方面,學校着重學生對所學知識的回饋及反思,有助於教師即時評估學生所學,更有利教學相長。所以在每單元最後一節,教師均會請學生回饋該單元所學的知識及自評學習表現和感受,愛固所學。

在培育方面,秉承學校「修己善群」的校訓,本校繼續推行「一人一服務」計畫,讓全校的高年級生有 貢獻自己的機會,本校更為全校的服務生提供領袖訓練計劃,建立學生的自信心、責任感和領導才能。為配 合關注事項「提升學生重人重己的素質」,學校特別重視學生的自理能力及關愛表現,本年度更優化了「有 禮班」及「有禮醒神雙週」比賽,學生從個人到群體中講究禮儀和關愛,進一步發揮「修己善群」的精神。 本校亦透過校園電視台廣播關愛主題節目,潛移默化地教育學生關愛社群、貢獻社群。

教師專業發展

要提升學與教的效能,首要考慮的就是教師的專業能力和水平。學校一直積極為教師提供持續專業進修的機會,建立優秀的教師團隊。在中文科方面,本年度我們與中文大學合作,優化小二的閱讀課程,重點為字詞教學課程的整合。我們亦參加了教育局的「專業發展學校計劃(2013-14)」,與天主教石鐘山紀念小學進行一系列的訪校活動、工作坊及觀課、議課及經驗分享。在英文科方面,則獲教育局撥款English

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Enhancement Grant Scheme (EEGS)及課程發展的Language Learning Support Section (LLSS),令英文科同事更能專注如何提升學生的閱讀與寫作技巧;數學科的「數學社群老師計劃」,加強數學科的協作教學及教師同儕互評,定期就指定課題作備課及觀課等專業交流;而「內地教師交流計劃」則提供了平台讓中港兩地教師了解彼此課程的異同,從而反思如何優化數學科課程。在常識科方面,我們參與教育局資優教育組的「資優教育教師網絡(常識科)計劃(2013-14)」,嘗試於第一層全班式教學中培訓學生高階思維的能力,並與幾所學校組成網絡群組進行一系列的跨校備課會、觀課及議課等活動,從而凝聚專業團隊力量。本校的課堂實踐獲得外間的高度評價,並獲邀出席教育局資優教育分享會及全港性的資優教育雙年會作分享者,以分享校本課程及全班式資優教學實踐的經驗。



另外,本校中文科麥豪輝老師於香港教育工作者聯會所舉辦的「2014優秀教師選舉」中榮獲「優秀教



師(教學組)」殊榮,其教案、教材、課堂反思及課堂錄影均得到評審團的高度讚揚,在200多名參賽者中脫穎而出。麥老師獲邀加入「優秀教師社群」,並會在來年主持教學分享會、接受網絡電台訪問等,分享教學心得及經驗,推動中文科教學的專業發展。

此外,辦學團體當中不少教育界專家亦經常舉辦工作坊及講座,多方面支援教師,為教師提供新的教學點子及對課程作出反思。透過一條龍政策,更加強了中小學教師之間的觀課及議課,令彼此對中小學的課程銜

接、教學法及學生需要等作專業分析及調適。

為擴闊老師及學生視野,豐富經歷,本校於復活節期間舉辦了「台灣農場及藝術文化之旅」,帶隊老師共四名,在交流團中參觀了多個藝術展,並與當地師生交流視藝教學心得,推動專業發展。



學牛表現

學校透過安排學生參加不同種類的校外比賽,使學生寓比賽於學習,以自我提升的心態,延展所學。在 2013-14本校學生參加了各項不同類別的比賽,無論在參與人數和獲取的獎項方面均有理想的表現。

在2013-14學年裏,本校各科/組舉辦的延展活動合共超過80項,學生除了可參加各種不同的延展活動外,更有機會參與不同類別的校外比賽,無論在參與人數和獲取獎項方面均有理想的表現。在整個學年裏,參與各項校外比賽的學生共1,173人次:學術類有480人次、藝術類有272人次、體育類有421人次。

而在各項比賽中,學生均有優秀的表現,獲獎的類別和數目如下:

學術類的獎項:冠軍13個、亞軍24個、季軍33個、其他獎項128個

藝術類的獎項:冠軍1個、亞軍1個、季軍4個、其他獎項45個

體育類的獎項:冠軍35個、亞軍30個、季軍18個、其他獎項31個

學生在不同的範疇,特別是在中文、數學和體育方面均有優秀的表現。在體育範疇的整體表現出色,在游泳、欖球和田徑三方面尤其突出,無論參賽人數和獲獎數量均是最高的三個項目。而在中文和數學方面,至年參加了十多項的全港性活動及比賽,合共獲取超過130個獎項。

家校合作

學校與家長是教育孩子的良好夥伴,所以本校一向重視家校合作。家教會從1993年成立,從當時的雛型發展至今天的成熟期,家教會已有非常精確嚴密的組織。家長對學校的歸屬感增加,喜見樂意投入家教會活動的家長數目日益增加,家長與教師理事定期開會,為學校各方面的發展作出支援及交換意見。家教會會員樂於參加學校為他們舉辦的各種親子講座、工作坊及康樂活動。家長亦主動熱心參與學校的事務,組成龐大的家長義工團隊,發揮家校合作的功能,協助學校握行各種學習活動,截至六月中,曾參與服務的家長義工人數超過120人,服務人次達850次之多,共服務了接近1900小時,家校合作從二十年前發展至今天的成就,為此感激各家長的付出與貢獻。

總結

本校堅持和秉承「修己善群」的辦學理念,為天水圍社區提供優質的教育服務。在學與教及教師專業發展上,我們不斷積極地尋找可發展或優化的地方。未來,我們將一如以往,在教育的最前線上傾盡全力,家校一心,務求培育學生全人發展,在學術文化、體藝及品德情意上再創佳績。

過去一年,學校在教職員的努力下,得到家長的支持和信任,同心協力為同學營造積極、正面和關懷的 學習環境,不論在正規課程、延展課程、資訊科技與照顧個別差異方面,均取得良好的成績,現簡略報告如 下:

正規課程

感激辦學團體的支持,本校教師著力鑽研羅伯特蓋聶(Robert Gagne)的學習理論,並透過跨校與校內的同儕觀課與議課,提升課堂教學成效,初步所見,教師的課堂設計、教學流程及反思能力均有明顯提升。同時,在辦學團體贊助下,屬會四校中文科進行中小銜接課程發展,除檢視中小學中文課程,以減少重複與遺漏外,更為課程發展提供寶貴意見,亦為四校教師專業交流提供平台。

此外,中文科在發展寫作縱向課程的同時,亦加強「以讀帶寫」元素,除教科書教材之外,更精選一些文學性較強的校本閱讀材料,豐富學生語文素養。同時,中文科繼續進行即場寫作訓練,並要求同學進行同儕互評。就學生作品所見,寫作能力較以往大大提升。

英文科方面,除小一至小三繼續推行PLPRW計劃,小四至小五亦推行KIP計劃,以生動有趣的方法,訓練同學的讀寫能力,並配合平板電腦教學,令同學學習興趣進一步提升。由於計劃推行成功,本校再獲友校及教育局邀請分享課程發展經驗,並獲高度評價。

數學科一向重視發展同學的邏輯思維、分析和解難能力,學生成績一向優異。 本年度同學參加了多項公開校際數學比賽,成績驕人,其中最突出的包括:全港奧 林匹克比賽,一位同學獲金獎,並成為香港代表隊到星加坡參加國際賽;一位同

> 學獲「華夏盃」全國數學奧林匹克一等獎;2014 亞洲國際數學奧林匹克公開賽香港賽區晉級賽(港

澳盃),小四至小六各組共奪金銀銅獎10個獎項;在世界數學測試中,本校 一位同學更越級挑戰12-14歲組,勇奪「數學科及解難分析科雙優學生」榮 譽,成績令人欣喜。

正因為同學在學術上獲得全面的培養,有鞏固的根基,因此在各方面均 有平均而傑出的成就。本年度,本校同學在傑出學生選舉中成績優異,包括 一位同學入選「第五屆優秀小學生獎勵計劃」,成為十優學生其中一位,另 外一位同學亦入選元朗區小學校長會主辦的元朗區傑出小學生。





學校的延展課程目標是「擴闊視野,追求卓越」。我們為同學提供多元化的學習經歷,培養他們在不同 領域的興趣及專長,發展個人潛能。





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本年度共有超過700人次參加不同類型的比賽及活動,包括學術、視覺藝術、音樂及體育等範疇,並取得突破性的成績。

在藝術方面,本校繼續舉辦伊分樂團,刻意栽培同學音樂潛能。音樂科更於午間時段進行「音樂突襲」,讓師生有機會一同演奏樂曲,樂團成員又擔當小導師指導其他同學學習演奏樂器。各同學於活動期間十分投入,氣氛熱烈。此外,學校亦安排同學參加不同的校外比賽和活動,同學均表現出色。視覺藝術方面,同學在多項全港性的填色、繪畫及設計比賽獲冠亞軍獎項。在香港七人欖球賽的「支持香港隊」繪畫創作比賽中,一位同學勇奪冠軍,與眾欖球健兒一同接受傳媒訪問,並擔任開球禮嘉賓。在2014香港創意思維活動服飾巡遊匯演暨比賽中,本校更擊敗眾多勁敵,獲全場冠軍。

同時,為讓每一位學生都有機會踏足舞台,成為校隊,全體小四學生均被編入學校朗誦隊及合唱團,代

表學校參加校際朗誦節及音樂節,結果勇奪朗誦亞軍及合唱殿軍,更重要是令平日沒機會的同學也能接受正規訓練,獲得比賽的經驗,增強自信。至於綜合才藝表演,更成為每年度的盛事,接待校內同學、家長及校外幼稚園家長共超過一千多人,參與各項演出的同學累計超過三百人次。

在體育方面,本年度足球隊獲得優異的成績。除在各類型校際足球比賽中共獲一冠一亞兩殿軍,本校兩位同學更代表元朗區參加全港學界足球比賽。

另外,本校高低年級舞蹈隊在校際舞蹈節獲甲等獎及乙等獎,個別同學亦在拉丁舞比賽中囊括多個個人大獎。此外,在羽毛球、跆拳道、體操及武術等項目上,同學同樣獲多項個冠、亞、季、優異獎及團體大獎。由於同學於體育方面表現出色,多位同學獲得外間機構頒發獎學金,以茲鼓勵,包括三位同學獲柏立基爵士信託基金、三位同學獲王威信體學兼優獎勵計劃及一位同學獲屈臣氏香港學生運動員獎。

同學能在課外活動方面取得卓越的成就,實有賴教師團隊的承擔 與努力,家長們的鼎力支持,與及同學們的積極參與。



為更有效照顧不同能力學生的學習需要,學校嘗試以每週一次的分流學習形式安排不同能力的學生進行主科學習,讓教師可因應同學的能力及進度進行針對性輔導,結果令人滿意,不論高能力或能力稍遜同學均



有明顯進步。此外,學校運用不同的津貼,並感謝校董會支持參加「加強公營學校行政管理試驗計劃」獲得資助,加上家教會協助籌募發展經費,我們已順利完成鋪設全校光纖網絡及增購平板電腦,讓同學可以一人一機運用平板電腦上課,除大大提升學習動機及興趣外,教師更能即時評估學生學習成效,以調整教學方向及步伐。

過去一年,學校在良好和穩健的基礎上,進一步提升學與教的水平,令學 生有更全面的發展。從小一收生情況,家長的口碑,反映出區內家長對學校的 支持和信任。家長一直都是學校的合作夥伴,也是學校的重要資源,我們十多

位家長理事,以及近百位家長義工,為學校、學生勞心勞力,付出時間和精神,讓同學經歷多姿多采的校園 生活,謹此向他們衷心致謝。

最後,多謝教師和職工團隊的努力和付出,致力營造一個整潔、舒適、安全、講求效率的學習環境,讓 同學可以感受到正面、積極、關懷的學校文化,並健康和愉快地成長。

QESOSA Secondary School 2013-2014 School Report

Ho Suk Yee, Principal

Staff Strength

In addition to the standard establishment under the Code of Aid, our school was able to secure other funds to recruit 19 additional teachers. Among the teaching staff, 51% were higher degree holders and the remaining 49% degree holders. 96% have been professionally trained. All teachers of English Language and Putonghua have met the requirements of the Language Proficiency Assessment.

Public Examination Result

Students had satisfactory performance in the 2014 Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education (HKDSE) Examination. Among the 145 students who sat for the Examination, 81.9% met the general entrance requirements for sub-degree

programmes and 39.5% met the general entrance requirements for local four-year undergraduate university programmes. The average credit rate (attaining level 4 or above) was 31%. On average, each student had 1.8 subjects attaining level 4 or above. Quite a number of students attained good results. The best student got a level 5 * and 3 level 5s.

Inter-school Activities and Awards Won

Our students demonstrated gifted talents and outstanding performance in territory wide competitions and were granted opportunities to participate in international events. One student was chosen as the captain of the Asian Schools Football Championships in Thailand and Indonesia. One student was selected to join the Hong Kong Rope Skipping Team and would represent Hong Kong to participate in Singapore. Before the selection, she has already captured 1 gold medal and 1 bronze medal for individual champions in All School Rope Skipping Competition 2014 organized by Hong Kong Rope Skipping Association. One student participated in both the Czech Republic Handball Competition and the World Rope Skipping Championship in Hong Kong.





In the Hong Kong Schools Speech Festival, 3 students took the First Place (English session) and 1 the Second Place in Choral Prose Reading (Chinese session). In the Clipit 2014: A Student-created Film Competition organized by Education Bureau: our students scored both the Second and the Third Places. In the 25th Secondary Students' Best Ten Books Election – Book Report Writing Competition, 2 students won the Recommendation Prizes, 1 in the senior group and 1 the junior group.

Our students continued to have good performance in visual arts. In the Secondary Students Fight Crimes Figures Design Competition organized by Yuen Long District Fight Crime Committee, 1 student took the Second Place and 1 the Third

Place. In the "Star River" National Children's Fine Arts, Calligraphy & Photography Contest organized by China Youth & Children Research Association. 2 students won the Grand Award.

We had a fruitful year in sports competitions too. In the Yuen Long Inter-school Football Competition, our school won the Champion for Boys' A Grade. In addition, we also won the First Runner-up in the Inter-School Handball Competition for Girls' A Grade in the Hong Kong Schools Sports Federation – Yuen Long Secondary Schools Area Committee. In the Inter-School Cross Country Competition (Yuen Long), our students won the Second Place and Fourth Place for Girls' A Grade and Girls' C Grade respectively. Numerous team awards were received in sports competitions including football, swimming, basketball, handball, cross country, rope skipping, volleyball and table tennis.

We encourage our students to explore external scholarships or fellowships this year. One Secondary Five boy was recognized for his active participation in community services and was awarded HKD3000 for the W I Cheung Scholarship 2013 of the Boys' and Girls' Clubs Association of Hong Kong, while 5 students were granted merit prizes. Our Head Perfect was granted HKD5000 for the "Pursuing Excellence and Beyond" Youth Leader Award (2013-14) organized by Fung Hon Chu Education Fund. Six students were nominated to participate in the Student of the Year Awards organized by the SCMP and HKJC because of their excellence in sports, arts and community services, and were awarded merits. Two students were awarded the Methodist Study Trust Fellowship sponsored





by the Hong Kong Methodist Church. Three students were granted the Upward Mobility Scholarship provided by the "Bless HK Scheme" of HKSARG. Moreover, 32 students were granted the Student Improvement Award organized by the Youth Arch Foundation.

Sustainable Development Education

Our school continued to have outstanding performance in the promotion of education for sustainable development. In the ESD Learning Programme Environment organized by UNESCO HK, our students won the Grand ESD Award (Grade 2), the Presentation Award (Grade 2) and the Written Group Project Report Award (Grade 3). Besides, our students also performed well in Climate Youth Network organized by Green Power. We won the Outstanding "Climate Youth Ambassador" Team Award. Our school continued to send delegates to attend the Youth Conference of Caretakers of the Environment International which was held in Taiwan this year and a lot of valuable experience was gained.

School Profile

Our ninth school year continues to be hallmarked with quality assurances to sustain education practices and management policies that are both effective and able to shift forward the boundaries of learning opportunities. We have taken consistent measures to cultivate a sense of endurance, initiate ideas to address challenges and resolve the problems with reality-based assessment procedures and courage. We consciously forge ahead with the best assessment of the educational steps and tools that can maximize the prospects for success for our students. Students being our most valuable asset, we endeavour to find the most pragmatic solutions to difficult and complicated situations that arise in our students' learning journey. We diligently work towards making a positive difference in the way our students learn and we pledge our very best to nurture our students and prepare themselves for the multiple challenges they may encounter in future.

Class Structure

There are four classes in each form for S1 to S3 and five for S3 to S6. To maximize the learning outcomes and increase overall student performance, especially for students with learning challenges, we have adopted small class teaching in S1 to S3, dividing the four classes into six groups. Under such arrangements, peer learning and support are being facilitated. Moreover, teachers would be able to closely monitor the teaching schedules and use more tailor-made teaching strategies to the targeted groups, thereby enhancing the student learning outcomes.



Staff Strength

Our teaching staff consisted of 67 teachers, over the standard established staff number granted by the Education Bureau. All teachers employed have received their first undergraduate degrees, 42% of the teachers hold higher degrees and 97% have been professionally trained. Moreover, all English teachers have attained the required language proficiency as stated by the Education Bureau.

Student-centred Curriculum Support

Student-centred curriculum support which aimed at extending classroom learning, enhancing students' learning experience and broadening students' horizons was provided. There were more than thirty clubs and societies providing a wide variety of activities for students. Events, such as Chinese Cultural Day, Inter-class Mathematics competition, Science Exploration Week, Nature Touch and Circuit Run were held to encourage our students to apply their subject knowledge learnt in the classrooms. Field trips, outings and tertiary education institute visits were organised to provide students with an opportunity to get hands-on experience and equip students for further studies and career planning. Study tours to Singapore, Haiping of China, Mongolia, Taiwan and England were organized to widen students' horizons and let students experience the very best historic, cultural and natural sites in the world.

Different teaching strategies were adopted and tailor-made teaching materials were designed to improve learning outcomes and cater for learning diversities, including interdisciplinary reading and writing learning package development, differentiated assignments and assessments, fine-tuning of medium of instruction--teaching mathematics and geography in English in forms S1 to S3.

In order to provide more support to our would-be secondary one students, a bridging programme was offered during the summer vacation to facilitate the learning transition in core subjects and geography. At the same time, effective learning skills and good study habits were trained. Elements such as teacher-student relationship building, self-confidence enhancement and study goal setting were integrated into the team work and team-building activities.

English Enrichment Initiatives

The school is committed to developing students' language skills and creating a rich English learning environment for students. An English Learning Centre offers a wide variety of English learning activities including movie watching, magazine reading, online reading exercises and

board games, and also a diversified supply of teaching resources for students and teachers. Besides that, an English newsletter was published annually to update students on the latest school events, thus enhancing students' writing and reading skills. Varied activities such as writing and debate courses, TT Games Day, S1 and S2 Read Aloud Programme, Amazing Campus Tour, English

Songs Singing Contest, Hong Kong Schools Speech Festival, Study Tour, Drama Appreciation, S6 joint-school oral practice and inter-class competitions were also organized to help students develop higher levels of language proficiency and English learning interest through greater exposure and use of the language. Frequent speaking practices were scheduled for senior form students during the lunch time to enhance their use of English in communication. Additionally, after-school enrichment and enhancement programmes were offered to provide junior form students with assistance on schoolwork as well as help senior students better prepare for their public examination.

The mentoring programme by alumni from QESOSA Ontario Chapter for our senior level students ran for the second year. The programme did not only provide our students opportunities to practise their English (both oral and written), but also expose our students to the world outside Tin Shui Wai through the experience of the mentors.

2013-2014 Highlights and Achievements

In the third Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education Examination, the percentage of students obtaining level 2 or above in five subjects was 58%. The overall passing rate was 74% with 12% attaining level 4 or above in all subjects and a total number of 118 credits and distinctions were obtained. Three students performed outstandingly: Wai Nim Chi got one level 5*, four level 5 and one level 4; Ip Ho Yan Ian scored one level 5*, three level 5 and three level 4 and Ho Chi Fung scored one level 5*, three level 5 and two level 4. The results reflected the concerted effort made by our students and teachers in the past six years.

We provide all-round education to our students and aim at offering a balanced curriculum to develop students in the academic, arts and cultural, civic and moral, social service and leadership dimensions. Our students unleashed their leadership and strived to excel in regional and territory competitions. Chan Shuk Ying of class 4D was awarded the New Territories Top Ten Outstanding

Students Award organized by the Federation of Outstanding Students Hong Kong and the Yuen Long District Top Ten Outstanding Students Award organized by the Yuen Long District Secondary School Heads Association. Meanwhile Chow Wing Tung of class 4D and Chung Ka Yi of class 5Y were awarded the Yuen Long District Outstanding Students Award. Besides, Kwok Ka Wa of class 4E was awarded the Best Experienced Social Service Award under the Yuen Long Student Ambassador Scheme. Ho Yuen Ting of class 6A, Ng Wai Kuen of class 4A and Cheung Tun Shing of class 4C were awarded the Upward Mobility Scholarship of the Future Stars Scheme organized by the Hong Kong Council of Social Service, which gave less privileged students a great deal of encouragement.

In the academic domain, Lam Sze Yik of class 6H was awarded the Applied Learning Scholarship jointly organized by the Law's Charitable Foundation and the Education Bureau. A total of twenty-two students were awarded the first runner-up, the second runner-up and the Certificates of Merit and Credit in the Chinese Speech Festival and a total of twenty-three students were awarded the first runner-up, the second runner-up and the Certificates of Merit and Credit in the English Speech Festival respectively. In Mathematics, our students gained one Distinction and twenty-three Credits in the University of New South Wales (Australia) Global International Competition and Assessment for secondary schools. Meanwhile, two students got one Distinction and one Credit in the Australian National Chemistry Quiz organized by the Royal Australian Chemical Institute. Four students received the First Class Award in the Robot Intelligence DIY organized by the Creative Power Educational Association.





In the arts and cultural domains, Lee Pak Sum of class 5Y won the First Place in the Graded Piano Solo (Grade Seven) and one student got the Second Place in the Graded Piano Solo (Grade One). Forty-seven students got the Certificates of Credit in the Junior Girls Secondary School Choir and two students got the Certificates of Credit in Junior Girl Vocal Solo in Foreign Language in the Hong Kong Schools Music Festival. Moreover, Chung Lai Ho of class 2F won the Championship in the Stage Performance for secondary schools and My Favorite Magician Award in the Hong Kong Youth Magic Competition. Sin Long Fung of class 5T got the first runner-up in the School Photo Competition of the International Coastal Clean-up Hong Kong organized by the Green Council. The school dance team received the Bronze Medal in the Hong Kong Open Dance Contest. Seven visual art students realized the motto of our school, "Prepare yourself that you may serve", by participating in the project of "Vibrant Hong Kong @ YHA Mei Ho House", which aimed to increase the public's awareness to the historic Hong Kong landmarks.

Our sport teams won the championships in the Yuen Long District Cross Country Competition (overall girls' grade B), Inter-school Rugby Sevens Competition (boys' grade A) and Inter-school Indoor Rowing Championships (overall girls' grade B), Cyclo-cross Race and Cycling Race (girls' grade A) of the Outreach Coaching Programme, 400 m Race (boys' grades A and C) and 4 x 400 m Relay (girls' grade A) of the Yuen Long District Inter-school Athletics Competition, Discus Throw (girls' grade C) and 100 m Hurdling (girls' grade D) of the Yuen Long District Athletics Competition organized by the Yuen Long District Sports Association Limited and 100 m Free Style (boys' grade A) of the Yuen Long District Inter-school Swimming Competition. Yip Sin Hang of class 5T won the Hong Kong Student Sports Award organized by the A.S. Watson Group.


