Message from Chairman of QESOSA

Dear Fellow Alumni,

I am glad to report that 2017 was a smooth and relatively quiet year. This has left us with room to start planning for the 65th anniversary celebration of Queen Elizabeth School, which will take place in the 2019-2020 school year. The Celebration Dinner is tentatively set to be held in the latter part of November 2019. As for the details of other celebration activities, OSA will update our alumni when we come closer to the celebration year.

Among the activities organised by OSA in 2017, the Ball Game Tournaments were again the most popular one. Three ball game tournaments, namely Football, Basketball and Volleyball, were organised with a total of 117 matches played. A record of over 600 alumni count participated in the matches. Besides the support of the alumni, I have to thank the selfless devotion of the organising team as led by Steven Leung (92FA), Ernest Chan (95FA), Stanley Or (95FA) and Kenix Kung (99FA) to make the event a success.

The great support of Principal Yuen Kwong Yip and his team had made it possible for OSA to maintain a close relationship with QES. For this, I owe them a big thank! OSA participated actively in a variety of activities of QES in 2017.

It was the second year that OSA sponsored QES students with financial needs for overseas study tour. As expressed in the thank-you letters, the students treasured the opportunity to broaden their horizons and appreciated the support as provided by OSA. OSA has decided to continue this meaningful initiative in the coming year.

QES Alumni Mentorship Programme continued to be well-received by QES students. In 2017, 70 students from S3 to S6 participated in the Programme on a voluntary basis, with 60 alumni serving as mentors.

Managing and maintaining the School Camp has never been an easy task. To better plan for and manage the campsite, QES decided to reactivate the School Camp Development and Support Committee. OSA was invited to send representatives to sit on the Committee with members from the School, Parent-Teacher Association and Camp Warden Association. 2017 was a big year for the School Camp. Over 300 members of the QES family celebrated the 55th Anniversary of the School Camp on 11 November 2017.

For many years, alumni have participated in the QES Swimming Gala and Sports Day, and were able to get good results. In recent years, facing keen competition from the parents, the results of our alumni slacked off a bit. I hope that in the coming year, the alumni teams can win more medals in the 2 QES sports events.



Dr Arthur Hinton, former principal of QES, passed away in the United Kingdom on 23 November 2017. It is a great loss to many of our alumni. Dr Hinton was not only a teacher, but also a mentor, a role model and a friend to them. A section in this annual report is dedicated to the memory of Dr Hinton.

I am indebted to my fellow Exco members for their patience and tolerance; and to the alumni volunteers for their time and effort devoted to the OSA activities. I would also like to extend my thanks to alumni who have supported the work of OSA by their participation.

I look forward to your continuous support for the betterment of OSA!

Message from Chairman of QESOSAEPO

Dear Fellow Old Students,

QESOSA Education Promotion Organization is the school sponsoring body of 2 primary schools and 2 secondary schools, all located in Tin Shui Wai. Its inception can be traced back to the eighties, when QESOSA planned to pay tribute to Queen Elizabeth School by bringing quality education to the community. It is the belief of OSA that education can bring out the virtues of a person and prepare young people to serve society – echoing the QES motto *Vos Parate Ut Serviatis*. OSA therefore invited a group of QES alumni, mostly education veterans, to set up EPO to embark on the endeavor.



Our first school, QESOSA Primary School, was established in April 1992. In the school year 2017-2018, we will be celebrating the 25th anniversary of our 2 primary schools. Over the past two and a half decades, the values of QES have been spread to over 10,000 young people. The 4 schools are among the most sought after ones in Tin Shui Wai due to their high reputation for students' academic performance as well as the schools' moral and character education.

I have to express my gratitude to the mastermind of EPO – our respectable Tsoi Sir, Mr Tsoi Heung Sang (59FA). His dedication to education, his wisdom and his extensive knowledge are unmatched. In 2017, Tsoi Sir decided to step back from his role as Honorary CEO of EPO. Although I have a sense of loss, I am sure Tsoi Sir will be there for us when in need. Tsoi Sir is forever the icon of EPO. Let's give Tsoi Sir a standing ovation for his invaluable contribution to EPO!

The road ahead is challenging. The world is changing so fast that we have to, as never before, rethink how to prepare our students for their future. In the digital era, cognitive skills go beyond the mastery of academic content. Our schools will stress on nurturing the students' curiosity, creativity, critical thinking, communicating abilities, problem solving as well as collaboration skills. I trust that through the concerted effort of our passionate and committed alumni, Principals and teachers, our goals can be achieved.

Besides the 4 schools, EPO also provides education services to the Tin Shui Wai community. We support the Capacity Building Mileage Programme (CBMP) mainly for women since 2008. Our schools encourage parents of our students to join the Programme, so that they can stay connected with society and serve as a role model for their children for lifelong learning.

Elder Academy is another education service provided by EPO. We are the first batch of elder academies invited by the Elderly Commission and Labour and Welfare Bureau to pioneer the project in 2007. Over the 10 years, we have provided courses and activities to over 2,000 elder-counts. Our Elder Academy celebrated its 10th Anniversary on 28 June 2017 with Dr Leong Che Hung as guest of honour.

I cannot thank everyone enough for their contributions to the achievement of EPO. To sustain the good work of EPO, I look forward to having more support from our alumni.

Message from QES Principal



The previous school year was a reminiscent of abundance and prosperity. The Swimming Gala held on 21 September 2016 was graced with the presence of our Guest of Honour, Dr WONG Lap-ming and the Parent Representative of School Management Committee (SMC). Dr WONG shared with us his participation in the sports events in QES and reminded us the spirit of never giving up.

For the Sports Day that took place on 6 & 7 October 2016, we were pleased to have Mr IU Kok-kin, the then Principal of Lung Cheung Government Secondary School and now the Principal of Yuen Long Public Secondary School to officiate at the prize-giving ceremony. Mr IU, as an active competitor in the sports events during his school days in QES, is still an enthusiastic participant in the Ball Game Tournaments of OSA.

Our alumna, Dr CHUNG Wai-ling Margaret, the Founding President of Regeneration Charity and Chairperson of Research & Education Committee, shed light on our Annual Speech Day held on 2 December 2016 by being the Guest of Honour. Her perseverance and positivity towards life and hardships throughout the years strongly motivated us to achieve the greatest, irrespective of the unfavourable situations we are now in. She also humbly reminded us that devotion and enthusiasm for work was another key to success.

The OSA's activities brought alumni across the decades back to their alma mater and joyfully recalled their delightful memories in QES.

One of them was the Ball Game Tournaments which took place from December 2016 to

March 2017, with the finals being held on the Homecoming Day on 17 March 2017. With tens of matches of basketball, football and volleyball being held on Sundays within four months, the highlights of the finals and the Annual Dinner of OSA in the same evening brought back numerous alumni who returned with their families, making the whole day a carnival for all ages. Such warm and festive events enlivened the campus, while at the same time alumni could have a close encounter with our students and understand better the school development because it was, as well, the Open Day of the school. No wonder the 'multiple delights' of the event were still being shared out among the alumni and most of them are looking forward to another one this year.

The Mentorship Programme, which was kicked off on 15 October 2016 and then followed by 4 other talks or sharing sessions, was a success. Over 30 alumni with different expertise and from various work sectors served as the mentors and sincerely informed our S3 to S5 students of their sweat and joy in their professions and motivated our students to prepare well for their future careers. In the Camp Wardens' training, the Old Camp Wardens took up an active role in guiding our potential and existing Camp Wardens to be responsible and independent keepers of the School Camp. They, as well, volunteered in a lot of School Camp maintenance work such as lawn mowing and others, which helped keep the QES School Camp both the unique and a captivating venue for students' gathering and development.

On top of the above, the OSA and the alumni generously supported the school through numerous donations and sponsorships. The OSA sponsored \$100,000 for an eye-opening and educational trip to Cambridge, UK in July 2017 and a total of 8 students benefited from the sponsorship. The OSA also donated \$100,000 to the School Camp Development and Maintenance Fund for the future development of the School Camp. In addition, we are also grateful to the lavish donation from the alumni, namely, Ms CHU Yuk-chun(72FA), Mr SHUM Man-kai(70FA), Mr TONG Wai-lop(74FA), Mr WONG Kai-chung(86FA), Dr WONG Chow-ming(76FA), Dr WONG Lap-ming(83FA), Mrs LIU WONG Sheung-mei(61FA) and 65FA, as well as 66FA.

Apparently, the bonding between the alumni and QES has never ceased. We strongly felt the hearty support of the OSA and the alumni, who have effectually passed on the spirit of QES to our current students year after year. 個不休。當然少不了昔日在伊中常跳，經典的「可愛的蘇珊娜」、「蛇舞」、「龍舞」、「栗樹舞」、「求雨舞」、「所羅門王的光輝」、「大衛王舞」、「菲律賓竹舞」、「十個美女」、「花都圓環舞」、「農家樂」、「混合探戈」等永恒的舞步，不勝枚舉。舞蹈指導們合作無間，互相支援，悉心指導，在此一眾舞民向他們致敬，多謝他們勞心勞力，帶給我們歡樂時光，舒展筋骨之餘，又令我們舞技大增，樂在其中，這一切快樂舞聚的火焰，將在新一年繼續燃燒，發光發熱！

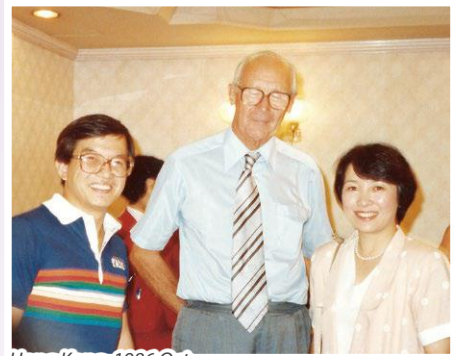
In 1967, Dr Hinton was promoted from QES to Principal of Northcote College of Education (NCE). He served as Principal of NCE for the next 7 years. Before reaching the compulsory retirement age of 55 for government servants, he obtained permission for "early retirement" in 1974 to continue to serve the local educational community as a lecturer of the Chinese University of Hong Kong. Dr Hinton completed his career in HK when he left on 23 July 1980 to enjoy his well-earned retirement, first in Austria for a few years, and then back in the UK. During his years of retirement, he kept in touch with his former QES students, and visited them in Hong Kong and in other parts of the world.

I am so lucky to be one of them. Without the generous act of the DSA, I would not be able to go to the University of Cambridge, one of the most prestigious universities in the world. Neither would I be able to go to London, the historically and globally well-known city, nor would I be able to meet and befriend with people on the other side of the globe, e.g. Brazil, Israel, Russia and Turkey. And I definitely would not be able to get close friends that are like brothers and sisters to me as we all spent our time together '24/7' for 12 days in a foreign country.

This tour has given me so many things that money cannot buy. It was lovely to have a chance to spend my days blithely in Europe with my schoolmates. Words cannot describe what I experienced and how I felt, but one thing I certainly know is that I am really lucky and grateful to have such a great experience.

The environment in Cambridge was comfortable and really different compared with Hong Kong. It could be the best place for students! When I woke up in the morning, I could see a beautiful picture with a green field and blue sky with fresh air in a very quiet environment and that was delightful. It let me feel really energetic when I woke up. I didn't need to be stressed out for being in a crowd and feeling 'busy' on the MTR. It was comfortable to be in a silent and pretty scene. I felt great and ready every morning. Sometimes, I thought I was in a dream as I had never thought I could be in a place where I could be totally relaxed. It was so nice to meet my friends in the morning. Though we needed to line up outside the dining hall to wait for our breakfast, we were still so satisfied since we could have a little chat with each other freely. Because of this new habit and environment, I got rid of a bad habit: keep staring at my mobile phone all the time. I would rather enjoy talking with them than using my phone and the most amusing thing was I even learnt some Portuguese. That was funny!

I also had a Cambridge town tour and visited London where so many historical and classical buildings were located. They were so realistic since it was the first time I could see and even touch the buildings in person! Not in a book or a magazine! I could see how the Eastern and Western styles are different. It gave me a lot of feelings. I took a lot of pictures to keep good memory of the visit. I was excited and happy to understand more about the places. The most memorable location I went was Harry Potter Studio for sure. I was shocked to find out how large it was and everything in front of me was remarkable. Costumes of Harry Potter, statues of every character and even the different scene settings were fantastic! It was just like an original screening in front of me.

I felt truly lucky and thankful. Because of Queen Elizabeth School Old Students' Association, I was sponsored to join this study tour. If I had not had any subsidy, I would not have been to the UK and experienced an unforgettable study tour that made me learn a lot and let me travel in a European country which is the furthest away country I have visited so far. It makes my dream come true! In addition, If I have an opportunity in the future, I will be happy to offer help to QES. I will always remember the things that a fellow alumnus told me, 'After you graduate from QES, if you have a chance, help students who are studying in QES just like we help you now.' Therefore, if I have the ability, I promise I will help more QES students in the future in order to give back to the School.

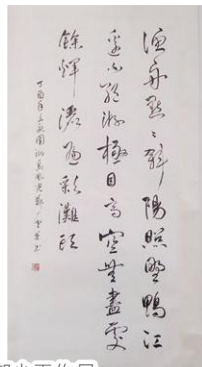

Queen Elizabeth School lost one of its most distinguished scholars when Dr. Joseph Yam Ting Woo (63FA) passed away on October 29, 2017 at the age of 71 in Silvercrest Center for Nursing and Rehabilitation, Briarwood, New York, USA.

During his days in QES (1958-1965), Dr. Woo excelled in all subjects, getting prizes on Speech Days in all disciplines -- arts, science and languages. In 1965, having come first in the matriculation examination of the University of Hong Kong, he was enrolled in the university as a King Edward Scholar. He majored in mathematics and graduated with First Class Honors. University of California, Berkeley came next, where he obtained his Ph.D.

Immediately after graduation, Dr. Woo taught at Ohio State University, then at University of Southern California. In 1977, instead of continuing as a college mathematics professor, he entered the field of bilingual education and later became an education officer in New York, a career that lasted many years.

Dr. Woo, an educator and author, was a man of many talents, from music composition to genealogy. Academically, besides mathematics, he was also an expert in linguistics. His specialty was the Chinese language and its many dialects. His book "A Linguistic Introduction to Chinese Languages", a QESOSA Education Promotion Organization publication, is a very rare contribution to the understanding of the Chinese language. Written in English, it is particularly valuable to English-speaking educators involved in teaching Chinese-speaking students.

In his book, Dr. Woo reflected on QES, "In looking back, I have come to realize how remarkable this school was... In the course of my career, I have been in many secondary schools, frequently as an evaluator of certain programs. In all honesty, none of them can compare with Queen Elizabeth School. At far too many, students lived in fear of being bullied physically or emotionally. Moreover, low expectations for student achievement combined with unchallenging curricula and uninspired and uninspiring instruction inevitably give rise to a self-fulfilling prophesy. Such conditions were utterly unthinkable in my schooling."

Out of his deep Christian faith, Dr. Woo was generous and loving. This was especially shown in his late years, when he befriended and mentored many young people in China, many of whom he treated as his own sons. He will be sorely missed among them.

The decline in Dr. Woo's health started from three and a half years ago when he had to undergo a quintuple bypass procedure on his heart, which unfortunately triggered a stroke due to a blood clot. Not an easy time that followed, yet he remained joyful, working diligently and persistently on his rehabilitation. In May of this year, he had a fall probably due to another stroke from which he never recovered.

前言

本校秉承辦學團體的辦學願景，為學生提供「正面、積極、關懷」的學習環境，悉心培育孩子自信、自律、自愛的學習精神。本年度，學校重點培養學生良好的學習習慣及學習動機，強化了生命教育課程，更開展了STEM課程及電子學習課程。

一條龍銜接

本會的中小學一條龍政策自2011年9月正式落實，一條龍政策已邁進第七年，行政架構及運作模式日益完善，一條龍督導委員會負責制訂有關政策，並支援有關措施和程序的進展。本年度有78%的畢業學生選擇直接升讀兩所屬會中學，展現了學生及家長對本會一條龍政策的信任及肯定。一條龍政策能為學生提供十二年一貫的全人教育，並能保持學校辦學理念、課程及培育方面的銜接和一致性，為學生提供一個穩定、正面、積極的學習環境。

為了讓小六畢業生及早了解中學課程，及能對個別小六學生及時作出適切的學習支援，學校與兩所屬會中學共同合作，為中一新生提供各種銜接課程及活動。

在課程銜接方面，本校的中、英、數、常四科的科主席均定期與屬會中學同工進行會議，檢視小學六年級及中學一年級的課程內容，對課程作出適當的調度及剪裁，務求令學生的學習經歷更有效度。另外，中文科特別設計了中小學中文科一條龍銜接課程，除了優化「文學及文化冊」及「文言文單元」，以啟迪學生對中國古代典籍的興趣外；更為小學六年級同學籌劃了「閱讀核心課程」，以朱自清、阿濃等多位作家的名篇教授學生閱讀策略，讓學生順利與中學課程接軌。

學與教

學與教是學校最重要的職能，是學校最基本、最核心的工作，因此亦是學校長期的核心發展項目。本年度，學校重點關注教師在課堂如何運用學習策略及提問技巧，以提升學生的學習動機、提升教師的教學能量，強化教與學的質素。

配合本年度的關注事項「培養學生良好的學習習慣及提升學生學習動機，以促進學生有效學習。」，本校繼續推行「自主簿」計畫，鼓勵學生以正確坐姿認真書寫中文字，並定期舉行美字比賽，表揚認真書寫的學生。本校更成立了課研小組，研究在課堂內不同的學習策略，並改善教師在課堂中的提問技巧，以啟導學生的思維能力，促進有效學習。

此外，本校承接上年度開展「校本生命教育課程」的成果，本年度繼續為課程作出增潤，設計每級的級本生命教育活動，以體驗式的學習活動讓學生提升個人素養，培養學生在「知、情、意、行、創」方面實踐正面、積極的人生觀。另外，生命教育小組在一至三年級開展生命教育繪本課程，豐富了成長課的學習模式及德育主題。



在「黑暗中的體驗」活動中，小二學生蒙着眼體驗盲人的日常生活，學懂感恩及關懷弱勢社群！

中文科製作了一、二年級的校本硬筆課程及三、四年級毛筆書法課程，讓學生掌握正確的執筆姿勢、運筆及裝字的技巧，認識中國文字之美。另外，本年度中文科優化「文學欣賞冊」的教學內容，令同學更能體現中國古典文學之美，並活出文學作品中的道理。為了提升學生的學習興趣，中文科特別在每月舉辦「語文遊戲角」，讓學生寓學習於遊戲，學習中文變得更有趣味。



English Book Week

英文科一直致力為學生創造運用英語的語境，設計了多元化的英文學習活動，包括English Games Day、English Fun Fair及World Book Day，讓學生走出課室，在輕鬆愉快的環境下學習英語，增加閱讀量，以提升學生的學習興趣。另外，更增設了Weekly Writing，培養學生的寫作習慣，增強學生運用英語表達自己的能力。

數學科重點關注推行「電子教學」，率先在課堂中引入iPad及電子書進行教學，並運用不同的應用程式以豐富教學策略，教師亦能即時跟進學生的學習表現，及時作出回饋。在設計課業時，教師更聚焦於課業中的數學化語言及應用題的計算，藉此增加學生的解難能力及幫助學生掌握數學的獨特思考模式。

常識科重點在校本課程中加入STEM元素，學生透過各種小實驗，了解不同的科學原理，從收集及分析實驗數據中作出各種結論。STEM課程培養學生跨學科思考的能力，並增強學生的協作、解難能力。



加入STEM元素的實驗課

在培育方面，本校繼續推行「一人一服務」計畫，讓全校的高年級生均有貢獻自己的機會。本校更為全校的服務生提供領袖訓練計劃，建立學生的自信心、責任感和領導才能。本年度更優化了「陽光學長與未來好學生計畫」，學生從個人到群體中講究禮儀和關愛，進一步發揮「修己善群」的精神。

教師專業發展

要提升學與教的效能，首要考慮的就是教師的專業能力和水平。學校一直積極為教師提供持續專業進修的機會，建立優秀的教師團隊。

在中文科方面，本年度參與了由香港教育大學舉辦的「促進實踐社群以優化小班教學支援計劃」，由小三科任老師成立課研小組，研究自主學習及教學策略，加強運用預習以促進學與教的效能。此外，五年級科任亦參加了由優質教育基金主辦的「主題網絡計劃—發展中文科校本課程(小學)」，研發了《西遊記》單元，以戲劇教學法融入小說單元，學生的學習動機大幅提升，成效卓越。

在英文科方面，本年度參與由教育局的英文校本支援計劃組舉辦的Language Learning Support Scheme，以發展小四英文科寫作課程，主要目的是增強學生運用英文寫作的的能力、說話能力及創意思維能力。

數學科則參加了由香港大學舉辦的「電子學習學習圈」，與友校舉行定期集課及觀課，共同研究如何在數學課堂中運用電子學習以優化課堂設計，提升學生課堂內的互動，並於總結階段與其他同工作專業分享。

在常識科方面，四年級科任參加由教育局舉辦的「專業學校發展計劃(STEM)」，與種子學校及其他參與的學校共同備課及觀課，以研究如何在小學常識課程中融入STEM教學，增強課程中的STEM元素及學生的創意思維、解難能力。

此外，辦學團體當中不少教育界專家亦經常舉辦工作坊及講座，多方面支援教師，為教師提供新的教學點子及對課程作出反思。透過一條龍政策，更加強了屬會學校之間的觀課及議課，令彼此對中小學的課程銜接、教學法及學生需要等作專業分析及調適。

學生表現

除了學科知識的增長外，對於學生身心均衡的發展，學校更是責無旁貸。為此學校提供了多元化的延展活動，於平日的課後時間、週末及長假期開辦不同類型的課餘興趣班，由專業導師執教。學生在整個小學階段均能參與五個不同範疇的活動，包括：文化藝術、康樂體育、社會服務/實踐、學術活動及生活技能。

此外，學校透過安排學生參加不同種類的校外比賽，使學生寓比賽於學習，以自我提升的心態，延展所學。

在2016-2017學年裏，本校各科組舉辦的延展活動合共超過80項，無論在參與人數和獲取的獎項方面均有理想的表現。在本學年參與各項校外比賽的學生超過1100人次，主要包括有學術類354人次、藝術類328人次、體育類420人次。而在各項比賽中，學生均有優秀的表現，獲獎的類別和數目如下：

學術類的獎項：冠軍11個、亞軍4個、季軍10個、其他獎項200個

藝術類的獎項：冠軍18個、亞軍8個、季軍3個、其他獎項20個

體育類的獎項：冠軍13個、亞軍11個、季軍14個、其他獎項30個

學生在不同的範疇均有優秀的表現，尤其在朗誦、欖球、排球、舞蹈，田徑及花式跳繩方面表現突出，無論參賽人數和獲獎數量均非常理想。

家校合作

學校與家長是教育孩子的好夥伴，所以本校一向重視家校合作。家教會從一九九三年成立，從當時的雛型發展至今天的成熟期，家教會已有非常精確嚴密的組織，家長與教師理事定期開會，為學校各方面的發展作出支援及協助。家教會會員樂於參加學校為他們舉辦的各種親子講座、工作坊及康樂活動。家長們組成龐大的家長義工團隊，發揮家校合作的功能，協助學校推行各種學習活動，截至六月中，共有142位家長參加本校的義工工作，服務人次有841人次，總時數達到1580小時。家校合作從二十多年前推展至今天的成就，實有賴各家長的付出與貢獻。

前言

過去一年，學校在校董會的帶領下，加上教職員的努力，家長的支持和信任，共同協力為同學營造積極、正面和關懷的學習環境，不論在學與教、延展課程、品德培育、資訊科技發展與照顧個別差異方面，均取得良好的成績。

學與教方面

本校的課程設計及教師教學效能一向深獲學界同工欣賞及認同。本年度，我們在原有基礎上，繼續以「培養學生自主學習能力」為主要發展項目，在不同科目進行自主學習能力培訓，包括增加課前預習、改變堂課及家課的模式、增加課堂電子學習元素、推行跨課程閱讀等等。本校並與各大專業教育機構合作，開發不同的課程，包括中文科參與教育局課程發展處的讀寫種籽計劃，又參與教育大學的自主學習教學研習圈，與友校互相交流。英文科與教育局外籍英語教師組合作無間，本年度除繼續參加Primary Literacy Programme for Reading and Writing(小學英語讀寫綜合課程)及 Key Stage 2 Integration Programme(第二學習階段英語綜合課程)，又協助該組在一、二年級開展 Reading Town App讀寫教學計劃，結合有趣的故事書及該組研發的評估應用程式，令同學對學習英語充滿興趣，教師亦能更適切跟進同學的進度，作出更快更到位的回饋。至於數學科則參加中文大學的「課堂語言心理研究計劃」及教大的「自主學習的課堂與課業設計研習計劃」，發展及推動數學科自主學習模式。而常識科亦參加中大的優質學校夥伴協作計劃，為小四設計以科學探究為核心的STEM課程，在提升學生學習動機及探究精神取得極佳的成果。

多謝辦學團體的專業支援，與及同事的努力，各項課程發展均有顯著成效，各科均獲邀向其他小學分享成功經驗，並獲得各界高度評價。其中資深教育工作者趙志成教授更在報章撰文分享本校課研的心得，又對本校教師專業精神給予嘉許和肯定。



首屆品德教育傑出教學獎

良好的學科基礎令同學在不同的校外學術比賽中獲得肯定，在中、英文及數理方面均奪得多項全港性大獎。此外，有一位同學在由新界鄉議局主辦、新界鄉議局元朗區中學校友會及元朗鄉議局中學協辦的元朗區傑出小學生選舉中獲優異獎，一位同學獲元朗區校長會頒發傑出小學生獎，四位獲頒學生飛躍表現獎，成績令人鼓舞。

延展課程方面

學校的延展課程目標是「擴闊視野，追求卓越」。為讓不同能力的同學均有發展潛能、受訓及表演的機會，學校安排不同的同學參加各類型校隊訓練，與及擔任小司儀或導賞員，並在早會、綜合成果展等活動中給同學鍛鍊的機會，讓同學有多元化的學習經歷，培養他們在不同領域發展個人潛能，建立自信。

本年度全校學生共793位學生，而參加校外比賽人次則逾1,200人，超過700人次獲獎。當中不少同學都是首次代表學校參賽，以汲取經驗，更有不少首次參賽已獲獎，獎項涉及音樂、視覺藝術及體育等多個範疇，對學校和同學都起了很大的鼓勵作用。

在藝術方面，伊分弦樂團表現日趨成熟，音樂科更於午間時段進行「音樂突襲」，讓師生有機會一同演奏樂曲，樂團成員又擔當小導師指導其他同學學習演奏樂器。此外，本年度繼續設立合唱團和民歌隊，同學在校內及校外均表現出色，除在比賽中獲得優良成績外，合唱團更與辦學團體長者學院合唱團合作，作公開演出，實行長幼共融，演出大獲好評。視覺藝術方面，同學在多項全港性的填色、繪畫及創作比賽獲獎，發揮創意之餘，也贏得不少掌聲。自全新的校園電視台投入服務後，培訓了一支由師生組成的台前幕後製作團隊。憑著優秀的編、導、演技巧、創新的拍攝手法，電視台在過去一年囊括全港多項公開及校際影片大獎，成績令人鼓舞。



在體育方面，本年度足球隊屢獲殊榮，在各校際足球比賽中共獲五冠、一亞、三季的佳績，更有兩位球員獲神射手獎。由於本校足球隊表現出色，有三位隊員入選元朗區地區代表(U13)，另三位更代表元朗區參加全港學界足球比賽，兩位隊員則入選流浪足球隊青年軍。此外，同學在手球、羽毛球、舞蹈、跆拳道、武術、體操及游泳等項目上，同樣獲多項冠、亞、季、優異獎及團體大獎。另外在長跑、欖球、辯論、機械人等項目亦取得突破性獎項，

成績令人驚喜。由於同學於體育及藝術方面表現出色，多位同學獲得外間機構頒發獎學金，以茲鼓勵，包括四位同學獲王威信體學兼優獎勵計劃、一位同學當選元朗文藝之星，一位同學獲屈臣氏香港學生運動員獎。

同學能在課外活動方面取得卓越的成就，實有賴教師團隊的承擔與努力，家長們的鼎力支持，與及同學們的積極參與。



品德培育方面

學校一向致力培養學生在學術、才藝及品德情意各方面有均衡而全面的發展，實踐校訓「修己善群」的精神。本年度，學校除繼續培養學生良好的學習習慣外，更針對港孩現象，加強學生自理訓練，又在各級舉行家長講座，亦繼續在小四舉辦自理營。各項計劃及活動成效顯著，深受家長認同。

在班級經營方面，各級教師透過定期的班級經營會及個案跟進會，有效掌握同學的情況，及早制定預防措施，同時又積極商討各項培育政策，並探討如何為教師提供適切的專業支援。結果除了令同學更守規外，教師亦更認同並投入培育工作。此外，我們又透過服務學習、大哥哥大姐姐計劃，營造和諧而關愛的校園文化。

我們明白品德情意的培育單以言教已不合時宜，單調乏味的教材及教學模式亦難引起同學共鳴，因此校園電視以成熟的師生製作團隊，在培育組成長課的穩固基礎上，以具創意的手法製作一系列「伊分德育劇場」，透過生動活潑的形式吸引學生，甚至家長觀看，讓大家反思生活細節中如何培養品德情意。結果大受師生及家長歡迎，亦獲得各界肯定，蘇偉恆老師更憑著具創意的品德教育方式奪得首屆品德教育傑出教學獎。此外，本校一位同學雖然是長期病患者，但仍能自強不息，一直保持優異成績，因此奪得「天水圍的孩子」比賽的自強孩子大獎。正如獲獎同學家長所言，除了靠孩子本身努力，學校的關懷和教導亦十分重要。我們深信在師生和家長的努力下，必能培育品學兼優，德才兼備的青少年。



資訊科技與照顧個別差異方面

為更有效照顧不同能力學生的學習需要，學校在部分級別以分流學習形式安排不同能力的學生進行主科學習，讓教師可因應同學的能力及進度進行針對性輔導，結果令人滿意，不論高能力或能力稍遜同學均有明顯進步。此外，學校得到教育局撥款，加上有辦學團體和校董的支持，與及家教會協助籌募發展經費，我們已進一步完善網絡基建設施，亦增購平板電腦至89部，讓不同班別的同学可以同時間一人一機運用平板電腦上課，大大提升學習動機及興趣，教師也能即時評估學生學習成效，以調整教學方向及步伐。此外，學校改建了資訊科技學習中心，又添置了不少資訊科技設備，並引入mBot及編寫程式課程，不但令同學對科研興趣大增，也令學習模式更活潑及多樣化，大大提升了學習的動機。

總結

Staff Strength

Our school has a strong and professional teaching team. Among the teaching staff, 62% are higher degree holders and the remaining 38% are degree holders. About 80% have more than 10 years of teaching experience. All teachers have been professionally trained – 16% have had training in Special Education; and all teachers of English Language and Putonghua have met the respective requirements of the Language Proficiency Assessment.

Public Examination Results

Student performance in the 2017 Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education (HKDSE) Examination was satisfactory. Among the 142 students who sat the Examination, 86.6% met the general requirements for sub-degree programmes (i.e. Level 2 in 5 subjects including Chinese Language and English Language) and 43.7% met the minimum entrance requirements for undergraduate programmes (i.e. Level 3 in 2 subjects and Level 2 in 2 subjects, or “3-3-2-2”, for the 4 core subjects). The average credit rate (i.e. attaining Level 4 or above) was 32%. There were 7 subjects with higher credit rate than the Hong Kong average; they included Chinese Language, Liberal Studies, Economics, Tourism and Hospitality Studies, BAFS (Accounting stream), BAFS (Management stream) and Physical Education. Over 90% of our 2016-2017 graduates received offers from higher education institutions. Among them, 57 students received offers via Joint University Programmes Admissions System (JUPAS).

English Learning

English is a key learning area in our school. We aim to help students develop their language proficiency through a language-rich environment. Our students are provided with many learning experiences to practise and use English. English as medium of instruction (EMI) classes are offered in junior forms. Lesson time in English has increased progressively for subjects such as Science, Mathematics, Geography, Computer Literacy and Visual Arts. Our speech days, graduation ceremonies and sports days are conducted in English. Moreover, there is a Through-train English Games Day involving the 4 EPO schools; and during summer a Singapore study trip was held. We also work with our primary schools to align the junior form curriculum. To increase students' learning interest, e-learning has been introduced with all S1 students equipped with i-Pads for lessons. To promote reading, an Extensive Reading Scheme has been introduced. It incorporates a regular reading and speaking lesson into the S1 and S2 curricula. The Scheme also helps widen the scope of knowledge and promotes the use of English for academic purposes among students. All these are done in the hope that our students will become more confident in using English and enjoy their language learning experience.

School Activities to Broaden Students' Horizons

With the strong support from the Queen Elizabeth School Old Students' Association, and the networks we have established with different sectors of society, our students were able to break through geographical and cultural barriers and pursue learning opportunities in mainland China and overseas. In 2016-2017, cross-border learning activities included a cultural study tour to Yangjiang, a cultural exchange tour to a sister school in Beijing, a sports study tour to Shanghai, a tree-planting project in Inner-Mongolia, an annual Caretakers of the Environment International (CEI) conference in Oregon and an IT study camp in San Francisco.





Awards

Our students continued to have remarkable performance in various open competitions. Academically, our debating team was the champion of the New Territories Debating Competition organised by the Tuen Mun Outstanding Students' Association. In mathematics, our students were awarded several First Class prizes in the Pan-Asia Pacific International Mathematics Invitation Competition and the Third Class Award of COMO Cross-strait Olympic Mathematics Invitational Competition in 2016-2017. Our students also obtained merits in English and Chinese Choral speaking in the Hong Kong Speech Festival.

In addition, we had a fruitful year in arts and music competitions. We won various awards in dancing, microfilmmaking and painting. We were awarded the Gold Award in the painting category in the Hong Kong Secondary Schools Visual Arts Display (2016-2017).

In sports, our students were outstanding in territory-wide competitions and were granted opportunities to participate in international events in swimming, rugby and handball. Our school won various awards in rope-skipping competitions, Hong Kong inter-school swimming competitions and a number of track and field events.

With the constant challenges ahead, we will keep striving to provide the best learning opportunities for our students, to equip them with the skills required in the ever-changing society and to enable them to develop their talents to the fullest.

Staff Strength

Our teaching staff consisted of 65 teachers, above the standard established staff number granted by the Education Bureau. 100% of the teachers have received their first degree, 52% of them hold higher degrees, and 98% are professionally trained. All English teachers have attained the language proficiency qualification as required by the Education Bureau.

Class Structure

There were 4 classes in each form from S1 to S6. To maximize the learning outcomes and increase overall student performance, especially for students with learning challenges, small class teaching is implemented in junior forms (S1-S3). Under this arrangement, student learning is well-facilitated and carefully monitored. Teachers are more able to closely monitor/observe teaching schedules and tailor their teaching strategies to better cater for the diverse needs of students, thereby improving student learning outcomes.

Student-centred Curriculum Support

Student-centred curriculum support was provided to extend classroom learning, enhance student learning experience, and broaden students' horizons. There were more than 30 clubs and societies providing a wide variety of activities for students, including an English song singing contest, riddle of the week, an English writing course, Chinese cultural day, and an inter-class mathematics competition, to encourage our students to apply the subject knowledge learnt in classrooms to practical use. Field trips, outings and visits to tertiary institutes were also organized to provide students with an opportunity to get hands-on experience and equip them for further studies and career planning. Study tours to Australia, Taiwan and mainland China were arranged to widen students' exposure and to let students experience and treasure the very best historic, cultural and natural sites.

Different teaching strategies were adopted and teaching materials tailor-made to improve learning outcomes and to cater for learning diversity, including interdisciplinary reading

and writing learning package development, differentiated assignments and assessments, fine-tuning of medium of instruction, and using English as the medium of instruction in Mathematics and Geography in more capable classes in S1 to S3.

In order to provide more support to prospective secondary one students, a bridging programme was offered during the summer vacation to facilitate the transition from primary to secondary education. The programme aimed to offer students the opportunity to preview core academic subjects, namely Chinese language, English language and Mathematics, train them for effective learning skills, good study habits and self-discipline, and help them build self-confidence.

English Enrichment Initiatives

The school is committed to developing students' language skills and creating an English rich learning environment for them. The English Learning Centre offers to students a wide variety of English learning activities including movie watching, magazine and storybook reading, online reading exercises, and board games, in addition to a diversified supply of learning resources. Moreover, an annual English newsletter is published to share current school events, thus enhancing students' writing and reading skills. Various activities were also organized with an aim toward helping students develop more sophisticated language proficiency and learning interest through greater exposure and use of the language. These activities included level-based activities (S1 inter-class cooking competition, S2 inter-class choral speaking competition, S1 & S2 outings, S3 Through Train English Games Day, S4 inter-class story telling competition, S5 inter-class debate competition and S6 joint-school oral practice), an International Phonetic Association course, English drama appreciation, Hong Kong Schools Speech Festival, inter-school English oral practice, Thursday vocabulary teaching and study tour. Speaking practices were scheduled for senior form students during lunch time to enhance their use of English in communication. A variety of activities were also organized by the English Society throughout the year to get students more engaged in using English for both academic and non-academic purposes. Additionally, after-school enrichment and enhancement programmes were offered to assist junior form students with schoolwork, to help junior students establish a sound foundation for learning English, as well as to equip senior students with skills for the public examination.

2016-2017 Highlights and Achievements

Regarding the 2017 Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education Examination, over 53% of our students received Level 2 or above in 5 subjects, and the overall passing rate was 74%.

We strive to provide an all-around education to our students, and encourage success in realms beyond the academic results. Our students received recognition in a variety of arenas for their artistic, athletic, and scholastic pursuits. In the past year, 4 students were honoured with the Conduct Award, Academic Award, Service Award, and Physical and Cultural Achievements

Award in the Award for Most Improved Students Scheme. We also saw 11 students receive accolades/recognition in the All-round Appreciation Programme for Youths, including the Leadership Award, Active Involvement Award, Good Participation Award and Good Performance Award. Three students

got commendations from the Upward Mobility Scholarship of the Future Stars Scheme while one student in S6 was given the Leadership Award in the Youth Entrepreneurship Experience Programme.

Students were also rewarded for their scholarly pursuits. Two students in S6 received the Chinese Language Excellent Learning Outcomes Award while one S6 student was given the History Excellent Learning Outcomes Award in the Senior Secondary School Based Assessment Competition. In debating, one S4 student won the Best Debater Award in the Basic Law Debating Competition organized by the Joint Committee for the Promotion of the Basic Law of Hong Kong.

The Interschool Putonghua Competition saw 5 S1 students given second runner-up honors and one credit award. One S1 student won the third place in the Hong Kong Schools Speech Festival (English Speech) and 31 students were honored at the Hong Kong School Recitation Festival. Additionally, 2 S6 students were presented a merit award at the Liberal Studies Debate Competition.

In the field of mathematics, our students won 4 certificates, 11 credits and 9 merits in the University of New South Wales (Australia) Global International Competition and Assessment. In addition, one S2 student was the second runner-up in the Mathematics Olympiad. Finally, 4 S5 students earned second runner-up honours in the Geocaching Hunting Competition.

Students also performed well in the arts field last year. Our result in the Joint School Music Competition was fruitful, with our students winning 1 gold, 5 silver, 8 bronze, and 5 merit awards at the event. The competition also found the brass band being recognized as they received the Excellent Training Award. The brass band was also awarded the championship in the district competition. Finally, 11 students were awarded the bronze prize in the Modern Dance Competition.

Our school teams also had a fruitful year in sports competitions. Our athletes won championships in the areas of cross country race, rugby and football. For individual awards, 3 students earned Most Valuable Team Members Awards in the rugby games. Seven students were invited to join the Hong Kong Rugby team. Last but not least, 1 S6 student won recognition in the form of the Hong Kong Sports Awards.

Conclusions

It is the goal of all members of the staff to provide a lively and supportive environment in which all our students can develop the skills they will need to live rich and fulfilling lives. We believe that in doing so we are laying the foundation for a strong society and a bright future for the next generation.
