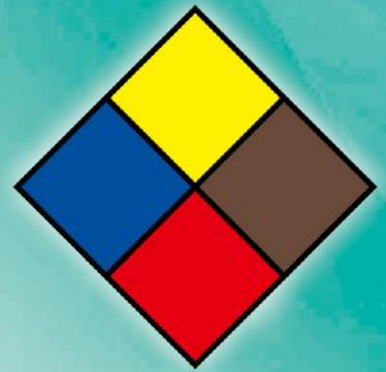

Message from Chairman of QESOSA

Dear Fellow Alumni,

It is my pleasure to report that OSA sailed through the year 2018, thanks to the unwavering support of my fellow Executive Committee members and alumni who are so generous to help in the work of OSA.

Our main event, Ball Game Tournaments (BGT) 2018 experiences another successful season. It achieves a new record of offering 145 matches with over 770 alumnus counts playing in the Tournaments. Since the introduction of BGT, Ms CHING Wai Ming, Jasmine (81FA) has been the organizer of the function. For the BGT 2019, Mr CHEUNG Kwan, Eric (77FA) has taken the helm from Jasmine as organizer. We are indebted to Jasmine for the success of BGT. She has dedicated years of effort in nurturing BGT to its current scale. With the solid foundation laid by Jasmine, I am sure BGT will continue to prosper under the leadership of Eric.

In 2018-2019 school year, QES has a change in principalship. Principal YUEN Kwong Yip was transferred from QES to another school. Alumni spoke highly of Principal YUEN. Under the leadership of Principal YUEN, the performances of QES students had improved significantly. In addition, the QES-alumni relationship has also been further enhanced. On behalf of the OSA, I would like to express our heartfelt appreciation of the excellent work of Principal YUEN.

Principal CHAN Cheung Wai succeeded Principal YUEN as the principal of QES. Within a short period of time, OSA has established a smooth working relationship with Principal CHAN. I would also like to take this opportunity to express our gratitude to Principal Chan and his team. It is only with their full support that the OSA activities could be such a success.

This year, OSA continued to support the development of QES students. Seventy alumni were recruited to serve as mentors for the QES Alumni Mentorship Programme. OSA also sponsored 4 junior form QES students with financial needs for a study tour to University of Cambridge.

I am delighted to report that OSA achieves good results in the QES sports events in 2018-2019. In Swimming Gala, our team 18FA won the 4 x 50 m Special Relay, and a mixed alumni team came third. As for Sports Day, an OSA mixed team won the 4 x 100 m Invitation Relay and broke the record of the event.

QES School camp suffered serious damage from Typhoon Mangkhut in September 2018. Thanks to the selfless service of our alumni and parents of QES students in cleaning up the camp site, the School Camp Visit could be held as scheduled on 10 November, just 2 months after the typhoon!

It has been our mission to bring in younger alumni to the Executive Committee. I am proud to share with you that the current composition of the Executive Committee is reasonably well balanced - out of the 15 Executive Committee members, 5 are from FAs of the 70s and before, 5 from the FAs of the 80s, and 5 from FAs of 90s and after. We will work on keeping the Executive Committee a vibrant one.

As alumni are well aware, QES will be celebrating its 65th anniversary in the 2019-2020 school year. QES, PTS and OSA have been working together for a variety of celebration activities. The QES65 Gala Dinner is scheduled for 23 November 2019 at London Restaurant. Other activities include Fundraising Campaign, Talks by Alumni, Homecoming Day and School Visit. Message from Chairman of QESOSAEPO

Dear Fellow Alumni,

The 2017-2018 school year marks a major milestone of the work of EPO in Tin Shui Wai. Our 2 primary schools, QESOSA Primary School and QESOSA Branch Primary School, celebrated their 25th anniversary on 3 March 2018. We are honoured to have Prof Wah Wan Sang (69FA), Provost of CUHK, as our guest of honour of the Anniversary Celebration Ceremony.



In addition to the 2 primary schools, EPO has also set up 2 secondary schools in Tin Shui Wai – QESOSA Secondary School in 1996 and QESOSA Tong Kwok Wah Secondary School in 2005. Sharing the same motto as our alma mater “Vos Parate Ut Serviatis”, the 4 schools strive for the creation of a positive and caring environment for our over 3,000 students, and for the creation of a self-improving environment that targets excellence, and promotes professionalism for our teachers.

The world of the 21st century is fast paced, with change occurring on every front. Therefore, it is not an easy task to prepare our students for their future challenges. Nonetheless, we understand that the traditional knowledge-based, didactic teaching is far from sufficient. With the help of e-learning, our schools have infused the self-directed learning elements into teaching to develop sustainable learning skills for the continued development of our students.

With digital technology playing an increasingly important role, our 4 schools have incorporated STEM into their curriculum, an approach to learning and development that integrates the areas of science, technology, engineering and mathematics. More important, STEM education enables students develop their skills in problem solving, creativity, critical thinking, and collaboration, communication, which are identified as the 21st century skills.

Our students will be growing into a future full of uncertainties. Therefore we emphasize on helping our students improve their resilience by providing them with a diverse learning experience to enhance their sense of accomplishment, promoting their positive thinking via life education, and cultivating their health awareness and habits. All in all EPO values highly the balanced development of our students.

Under QESOSA EPO Education Services, an arm of EPO lesser known to alumni, there are 2 community education programmes. In 2018, our Elder Academy offered 10 courses with a participant count of 182 elders, while CBMP offered 6 courses with 86 participant counts. A significant percentage of the CBMP participants are parents of our students. This has proven that we have achieved one of the objectives in offering CBMP -- to provide our own parents with a platform for lifelong education, thus setting a role model for their children.

The road ahead may not be an easy one, but I am positive that, with the continuous contributions of our teachers, the trust of our parents and the support of our alumni, we can make EPO better each day.

Message from QES Principal

Subsequent to the super typhoon 'Manghut' which devastated Hong Kong in September 2018 and left the messes of fallen trees, our dearest alumni volunteered to clear up messes at the football field and the places near the basketball court so that the Ball Game Tournaments of OSA could start in late December. 伊中舞聚 2018 年回顧與前瞻

已是第四個秋天了，記得在三年前（2015年秋），大家喚作「皇上」的舞聚帶頭人（69、70級聯黃仲基-黃總的尊稱！）和一班也是土風舞發燒友的伊中舊生，租了港島西灣河體育館的舞蹈室，揭開了舞聚序幕。

過去幾年，舞聚除了四處遊走，用「皇上」自尋的舞場，在香港、九龍、新界各地的康文署體育館，舉行不定期的舞聚以外，舞聚成員及「舞指」（72級聯的Anson麥明新伉儷）繼續爭取，成功借用九龍紅磡庇利街的社區會堂舞蹈室，作為伊中週日舞聚的「常備舞館」，並計劃延長舞聚的時間，由兩小時至三小時，由隔星期天至每星期天，甚至開始籌劃申請成為法定團體，俾能幫助借用其他地區的社區會堂，進行舞聚。我們亦繼續於「校友日」、「新生校營日」在母校新翼五樓活動室及西貢校營青蔥的草地上，舉行舞聚，重溫兒時在母校學跳土風舞的情懷之餘，也向現在就讀的學弟、學妹推廣這伊中優良傳統活動！

六位核心領舞人員，（除舊有舞指「皇上」、70級聯Amy朱瑞冰及Johnson范少雄以外）還有「安信兄弟」（76級聯的Andy方奕霖、72級聯的Anson麥明新伉儷）及「金剛」（74級聯劉呂富）和舞姿優美，體態輕盈78級聯的Wing馮嘉詠的全程投入，選舞、編舞、領舞...，這四男二女的導師組合，高效地帶着數十舞迷，踏着新舊舞步，手舞足蹈，享受着約兩週一次的舞聚。

除了已經熟練的舞步外，領舞小組為增加大家對跳土風舞的興趣，加深認識世界各地不同的土風舞，都選了有趣，易學和優美的舞步，以斬件式示範及練習，深入淺出引導大家學習，並加以小道具，利用手腳響鈴和扇子，加強舞蹈的節拍和動感，提升大家舞動的樂趣，每一回都教大家意猶未盡地踏出新學的舞步！

我們更為了減少因通訊、發通告、介紹舞蹈教材、上載舞聚相片及錄影片段、甚至團員之間的閒談而帶給其他舞聚成員無可避免的滋擾，成立了工作統籌小組，策劃舞聚的安排，並開設不同功能的WhatsApp chat group及面書網頁（Facebook web page）方便及集中與組員的溝通及盡量減少對其他無關組員的騷擾。

四年下來，大家熱情未減，很感恩舞聚反應是如此踴躍，不但成功吸納了很多伊中舊生土風舞發燒友及他們帶來，不分年齡層的親友嘉賓一同參與，甚至不少在外國生活的校友，回港也趁機參加這以「識跳跟跳，唔識跳，亂跳！」為口號的舞聚。

舞聚的成功，除了要靠帶頭人和領舞者之外，其他後勤工作的配合，團員的分工合作和支持也是很重要，每次看見「皇上」揹著喇叭箱，左擁右抱著電線及一大堆音響器材；隨軍記者「金剛」手拖裝滿攝影器材的行李箱，老遠從元朗趕來，為我們拍攝舞聚相片及錄影花絮，記錄每一場舞聚的舞步，讓未能參與的人可以分享自學；「大內總管」Winnie（71級聯郭慧卿）適切的後援，心細如塵的提點和管理一切大小事務及四位領舞者傾情執教，感動非常！

舞指們合作無間，互相支援，悉心指導，在此再向他們致敬，多謝他們勞心勞力，帶給我們歡樂時光，使我們在舒展筋骨之餘，又令我們舞技大增，樂在其中，各位團友的鼎力支持和配合及自動奉獻，製造或網購手鈴及扇子，贊助場地租用費，如此種種，充分發揮及實踐了伊中校訓「修己善群」的精神，這一切快樂舞聚的火焰，將繼續在新一年發光發熱！

Social Service Project (善群行動) 2017-2018

QESOSA Secondary School (QOS) has started the Social Service Project since 2004 in commemoration of the Golden Jubilee of Queen Elizabeth School. The Project which came to its fourteenth year was not only a meaningful social service project, but also provided a valuable learning experience for the participating volunteers.

"校營基金" 積極配合撥款，我們在五十天內極速修復主要設施。

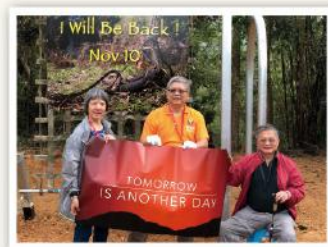

Professor LAM shared with students his dream and his story in the enlightening speech "Uphill Battles for Dream Seekers".



Uphill Battles for Dream Seekers

Professor LAM Hon-Ming

Dear Principal Chan, Teachers, Parents, Distinguished Guests, and Students,

As a member of the 78FA, I graduated about 40 years ago. 40 years! Wow! So fast! After all these years, I am really glad to have been invited back to my alma mater and take part in such a joyous occasion.

Graduating students, congratulations – on your successful completion of the secondary education. But most importantly, I am congratulating you for you have been groomed and equipped with capabilities to make something of yourselves. Many of you have just taken the stage and received recognition for your achievements, and I am sure, well deserved. You are certainly on the head start to be making something of yourselves. For those who did not get to come up here for the prizes, you are going to have your chances. Today, I am offering you my experience and I dare you, every one of you, to find your calling, to pursue your dreams, and eventually make something of yourself. Frankly, during my years in QES, I was such an under-achiever – I never once thought I could stand up here one day as the guest of honor in our Speech Day. But, here I am. You have no idea how happy I am! And yes, it's possible. It is possible to pursue your dream and make your alma mater proud. Allow me to take this opportunity to share with you some stories that could give you hope and strength in your endeavours ahead.

Those Were the Days before QES

Being the first-born in a grassroot family growing up in the old Tsz Wan Shan Estate, I was told early on that I might have to be an apprentice instead of going to secondary school so as to relieve the family's financial burden. You know, at that time, we did not have free, compulsory secondary education yet. My parents agreed to let me continue schooling on the condition that the tuition fees would not be too unaffordable. That was the first time when I felt I needed to fight for my future.

I went to my primary school teachers and asked for some exercise books, used or unused. I got up every day before dawn to drill myself for the Secondary School Entrance Exam. That was 1973. In a recent 78FA reunion, a fellow student shared with me a news clipping, reporting that, of all the primary school students sitting for the exam in 1973, the topmost 141 received the Government Scholarship, having tuition fees waived for the entire 5-year secondary school period. All the names of the recipients were listed and I was one of them! My name appeared on a newspaper! I was admitted to QES, a dream school for almost all my primary school schoolmates. This was my first turn-around.

Those Were the Days in QES

Mind you, I drilled myself for the exam by brute force. My English was in fact not quite up to standard. As most of the classes in QES were taught in English, I was devastated. The language barrier caused me to do poorly in class. Besides, you've got to know, of the 141 Government Scholarship recipients in 1973, almost 30 were admitted to QES! My form-mates were all very intelligent.



Relationship with QES

When I got to the fourth form, things got worse for me. I failed nearly all the major subjects. When my class teacher handed the report card to my mother, it was like a surgeon telling the anxiously waiting family outside the operation room that the patient was beyond help, and the family should prepare for the worst. Those were the days, my friends. I thought they'd never end...

Walking home behind my mother, looking at her back, I knew I need to put myself together and re-prioritise. My HKCEE results earned me a place in the matriculation class in QES, quite surprisingly, if I may, to me and mostly to many of my form-mates. So, my second turn-around. Unfortunately, my A-Level scores were not good enough to get me a place in any tertiary institution. I spent a year soul-searching and eventually got myself into The Chinese University of Hong Kong.

Every time I walk up the slope of QES to enter our school, I cannot help but think back to those days when I fought one uphill battle after another, for survival and for my future. As Scottish writer Samuel Smiles once said: "The battle of life is, in most cases, fought uphill ...". Our stories are bound to be different, but we all have our share of uphill battles.

Uphill Battles by Choice

While life presents us with many inevitable uphill battles, we sometimes take on challenges by choice. Some of my choices of uphill battles have shaped me into who I am today and possibly contributed to bringing me in front of you today.

For the last 20 years, I have been a scientist working primarily on soybean. Soybeans are very good stuff. Unlike most plants, they can replenish the nutrients in the soil through its nitrogen-fixing characteristic, thus reducing the need for environment contaminating fertilisers. So, you grow soybeans, reap the harvest, and your soil becomes better. What a great deal!



Let me tell you this, China has 22% of the world's population, but only 7% of the world's arable land. China is huge, but also heavily populated. Urbanisation of the recent decades has been eating into the farmlands. In addition, some areas are so dry, with little rainfall for plants to grow. Some are plagued by excessive salt. You can't grow much on these marginal lands that are stressed by drought and salinity.

My research aims at finding cultivars of soybeans that are tolerant to drought and salinity, so we can increase agricultural productivity and enrich the soil of marginal lands, to help farmers improve their living and to contribute to climate-smart agriculture.

I think my work is quite important. Don't you agree? The world population grows incessantly; but our Earth does not. To feed the world, we need more arable land. Reclaiming marginal lands is one way I hope my research will help to relieve the imminent crisis. Unfortunately, not everyone agrees. Many people in Hong Kong regard agricultural research inferior to medical or health related studies. It's just not sexy enough. When I began my independent research on soybeans 20 years ago, some well-meaning colleagues kindly reminded me that it would be very hard for me to get funding support for agricultural studies in Hong Kong. Indeed, in the beginning, I had to pay out of my own pocket for my field work. There was a time when I had to let go of a few well-trained members of my research team simply because I did not have enough money to keep them.

I admit, my research output came along quite slowly. After all, soybeans take time to grow. Sometimes, adding insult to injury, my soybeans on the fields got eaten by animals! My research often took me to places where "even birds would not lay eggs", that is practically in the middle of nowhere. I usually had to travel hours on bumpy dirt roads to get there. On many occasions, I have asked myself: why did I take this tortuous and bumpy road? Why didn't I choose an easier path?

My Calling / My Dream

Because of my grassroot upbringing, I have always wanted to do something for the underprivileged who have few resources and limited options in life. One day during my undergraduate study, I attended a seminar. The speaker talked about the grave need for scientists in China to improve people's livelihood. He pinpointed the emerging discipline of molecular biotechnology and how it was going to change the biological inquiry and shed new light on many lingering problems. It dawned on me then that this was what I wanted to devote my life to doing. People talk about calling. I think I found my calling then and there. For the next year and a half, I worked day and night to salvage my grades in order to secure a ticket to graduate studies. From M.Phil. to Ph.D. to postdoctoral research, I forged ahead knowing what I wanted to do for my life.

True, I could have chosen an easier path. But if the path is easy, there will be no shortage of people to take it. Few people are going to take the difficult path, if not I, then who? If not now, then when?

After more than twenty years of "cultivation", I am now harvesting. We have built a strong foundation in soybean research. Combining state-of-the-art genomic technology and the traditional wisdom of breeders, my colleagues and I generated new stress-tolerant soybean cultivars for farmers in arid regions of China. My research journey has been extended from basic science to application, from laboratory to fields, from Hong Kong to China and to the world. If, somehow, I have been able to make something of myself, it has to be because I dare to dream, and I dare to fight the uphill battles to actualise my dream.

Relationship with QES

A Few Words of Advice

As I said in my introduction, I wish my story could give you hope and strength to fight your own uphill battles to bring fruition to your dream. Let me give you a few advices that will come in handy:

1. **Embrace hardship and challenges.** They are in fact blessings in disguise. They are the catalysts that will stimulate your development. Stepping out of the comfort zone to take new challenges is a way to move to the next new level. If one chooses to stay inside his/her comfort zone, he/she will never know the true nature and potential of himself/herself. For a well-protected dormant seed to germinate into a seedling, it takes much energy and courage. There are many unforeseen challenges in the environment. But if a seed never germinates, it remains a dormant seed forever.
2. **If it is hard to make big changes, start with small ones.** Sometimes, it looks like that the inertia is too strong and everything seems to be stagnant. However, every small step accumulates to become some significant changes. Here, I would like to share a quote from Lu Xun: "There were no roads. As more and more people tread on it, a path appears."
3. **Build a support network of like-minded people.** As an old African proverb goes: "If you want to walk fast, walk alone; if you want to walk far, walk together." Trust me, the walk is going to be a lot more enjoyable with some good companions. With friends, we are no longer lonely. With teams, we can conquer more challenges.
4. **Have a thankful mind.** Be thankful to teachers and others who have been giving you timely and unyielding support. They are expecting you to spread the love and care to others who are in need. Pay it forward.

My dear fellow junior schoolmates, we cannot choose our upbringing; but we can decide how to live our lives. We cannot determine our starting point; but we can pick our path to take. We cannot change the past; but we can transform our future.

Remember our school song: "May knowledge from our works increase, and serve the world and spread the light. Be ours to share an active peace, among ourselves first learned aright." My younger schoolmates, go find your calling and work at it. Do not short-change yourselves. Make something of yourselves.

Today, I have the privilege to share with you my dream and my story. I am looking forward to listening to your dreams and your stories, in the future that is hopefully not too far away.

Let me end my speech with a more complete version of Samuel Smiles' quote for you to ponder: "The battle of life is, in most cases, fought uphill; and to win it without a struggle were perhaps to win it without honour. If there were no difficulties, there would be no success; if there were nothing to struggle for, there would be nothing to be achieved."

From 2 July to 15 July 2018, I took part in the UK Study Tour. In this tour, we had English lessons taught by native English teachers, activities with foreign students and sightseeing tours. It was really a memorable experience. I had a great time in UK!

We spent most of our time in Oxford. It is really a historical city. The buildings were built in old British style. Most of them were built by bricks. Its architectural style is totally different with the modern style in Hong Kong. Besides, the weather was nice. It was mild and sunny. I love the blue sky there, it made me feel comfortable. The British people were friendly to us. The drivers were willing to let us cross the roads first and the salespersons did not mind counting the coins as we did not know the values of the coins.

It was a great chance to have lessons there! There were only 10 students in each class so the teacher could focus on the needs of every student and increase the classroom interaction. The lessons were conducted in a relaxing way. The teacher taught grammar and vocabulary through playing games. It increased my interest in learning English. We also had the project lessons. We got into groups of 2-5 to do the project and we did 3 projects during the course. I like the project about London the most. I learnt more about the landmarks and the entertainment in London from the project. Moreover, I found out that doing projects trained different skills because we had to search and summarise the information, communicate with the groupmates and present our ideas to the other groups. Therefore, I enjoyed doing projects very much.

Other than having lessons, we had some activities including singing karaoke, playing treasure hunt and having international night with the students from other countries. I became a more confident person as I tried to make friends with the students. Through chatting with them, I knew more about the lifestyle and culture of their countries, and improved in communication skill. I am so delighted to meet them and I hope we will keep in touch in the future.

In addition, we went sightseeing. I enjoyed the visit to the Harry Potter Studio the most. It exhibits the props, costumes and sets of the Harry Potter's film production. Visitors can know more about the filmmaking process. It is a wonderful place for the fans of Harry Potter. If you are not a fan of Harry Potter, I am sure that you will be in love with it after visiting the studio! I was amazed by the model of Hogwarts castle which is in 1:24 scale. The model has detailed design. It clearly shows the creativity and diligence of the film crew. I am thankful to the film crew for making such an awesome series of films.

I am glad to have this precious opportunity given by the school and also the Old Students' Association. Without the OSA, I would not be able to learn, experience and enjoy all those I mentioned above! It was the OSA's generosity and help that I could enrich my knowledge and broaden my horizon. I will make good use of the skills that I learnt from the tour. It was an unforgettable experience. I am truly grateful.

Relationship with QES

I joined the UK Study Tour to UK from 2 July to 15 July 2018. When I first arrived at London Heathrow Airport, the sky caught my eyes. It was extremely blue, which made me feel relaxed and happy. I couldn't stop myself taking hundreds of photos with the beautiful sky.

There were totally 33 colleges in Oxford. We stayed at one of the colleges called Corpus Christi College. The buildings in Oxford were totally different from the ones in Hong Kong. They were in old British style, which were short buildings without any lifts and all of them were built with bricks.

We had English lessons at the college from Monday to Friday. It was a good chance for me to improve my English. The teachers were very nice and they taught us in an interesting way. They played different games with us so that we could learn English more easily. In the project lessons, we did several projects about the culture and some famous places of UK. Then, we went to the British Museum, which was the biggest museum in the world. We saw many exhibits from Egypt, China and Rome. I loved the mummy of a cat most, which was really interesting.

We also met some friends from various countries during the trip, such as Russia, France and Vietnam. We had lessons together, in which we shared the culture of our own countries with one another. It was great to know some interesting cultures of other countries. We also visited Abingdon, the oldest city in UK together.

I was really lucky to have such a precious opportunity to experience more. Here I must mention the Old Students' Association and express my greatest gratitude towards them. I am thankful that I was given the subsidy and the OSA really made this trip possible for me! Through the trip, I learnt not only English but also the skills of solving problems. I hope I can make good use of the skills to help me cope with problems



Going to the UK had been my dream. Luckily, I achieved it in July 2018 with the kind help of the Old Students' Association. The generous subsidy from the OSA made my dream come true!

Harry Potter Studio must be one of the exciting places we visited in the trip. I am a big fan of the Harry Potter books. When I saw the Forbidden Forest and the Hogwarts College in the exhibition, I was thrilled. They were amazing! They were realistic, especially the Forbidden Forest. The enormous spiders in it even scared me!

For me, the most relaxing activity is punting. We sat in the punts and admired the beautiful scenery. There we saw ducks and geese swimming near us. It was enjoyable. It was also my first time to punt with the pole. Actually I was a little bit nervous since I was scared I would fall into the water.

I think the most challenging thing in these days was getting used to the jet lag. You know, the time in UK is behind that of HK for seven hours. When it was six in the afternoon, it was already one in the morning in HK. When I stayed in UK in the first few evenings, I felt sleepy and tired. But in later days I felt better.

During this study tour, I met some foreign friends. We talked about something special in our countries and exchanged our IG names. I even had the phone numbers of some of them, so that we could keep in touch with one another. In some days, I had lessons and played games with foreign students. We were satisfied.

I've also met several new friends from my own school, such as Evana, Purple and Tiffany. We shared our good time with each other. Evana often told us jokes and ghost stories. Also, we sang songs, danced and laughed during the trip. We were cheerful.

回顧過去，展望將來，希望2019年有更多70級聯同學能參與我們工作小組為大家精心策劃的各項活動！

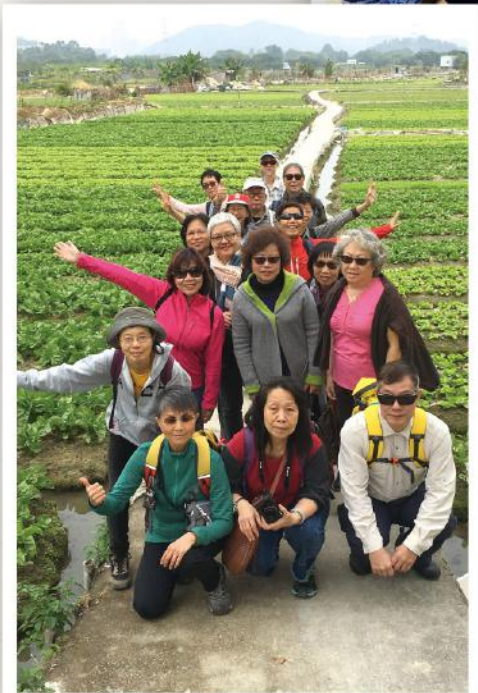

As colleagues at NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboratory, Caltech, for over thirty years, we worked in different areas most of the time. Edward was a manager with many outstanding publications in a broad variety of mathematical applications in space science and engineering, and also in the spin-off of technology from the space program. I was a manager who worked on missions to Mars, Saturn, and other planets, and my work involved sensitive information which could not be published. Fortunately, we had lunch together regularly and we talked about various kinds of topics.

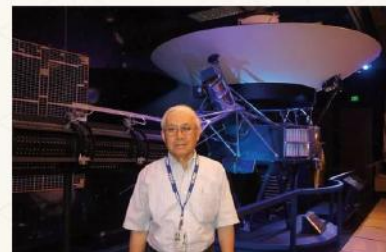

When I think of Edward, I think of an intellectual not only with outstanding scientific accomplishments but also a great friend with empathy towards the elderly and compassion towards the underprivileged and the destitute in our society. As an example, knowing some elderly people needed transportation to see doctors, he volunteered to provide transportation for them.

Edward's life was a testimony of excellence as a son, a husband, a father, a grandfather, a brother, an uncle, a professional, a friend, and an especially helpful friend to the elderly. Edward was well-respected and well-liked by his colleagues at NASA/JPL/Caltech. As friends who were honest with each other, we shared our thoughts when we went through good times as well as bad times.

A smile comes to my face whenever I think of Edward. The reason is that he had a great sense of humor and we often laughed together. He is resting in the peace and love of God, and I look forward to seeing him again in the eternity of spacetime.

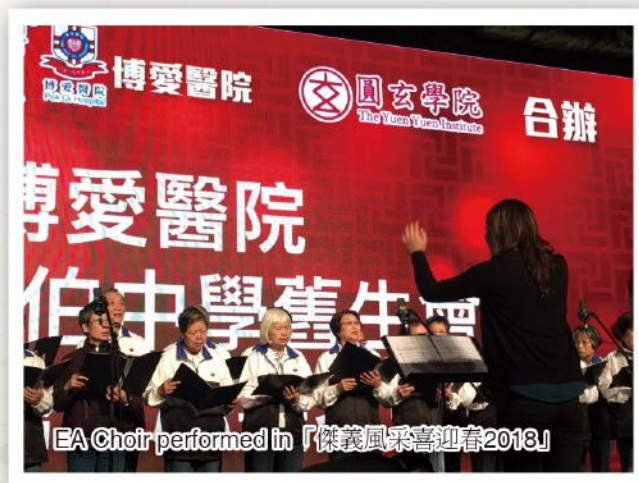

伊利沙伯中學舊生會小學 2017-2018年度校務報告

何敏薇校長

前言

本校秉承辦學團體的辦學願景，致力為學生營造一個「正面、積極、關懷」的學習環境，悉心培育孩子自信、自律、自愛的學習精神，使學生的身心、情緒和社群達到健康均衡的發展。本年度，學校踏入三年發展計劃的最後一年，繼續培養學生良好的學習習慣及學習動機、強化生命教育課程，更開展了STEM課程及電子學習課程。以下是本年度的校務報告：

一條龍銜接

本會中小學一條龍政策自2011年9月正式落實，一條龍政策已邁進第八年，運作模式完備，感謝一條龍督導委員會負責制訂有關政策，並支援有關措施和程序的進展。本年度有超過八成的畢業學生選擇直接升讀兩所屬會中學，展現了學生及家長對本會一條龍政策的信任及肯定。一條龍政策能為學生提供十二年一貫的全人教育，並能保持學校辦學理念、課程及培育方面的銜接和一致性，為學生提供一個穩定、正面、積極的學習環境。

為了讓小六畢業生及早了解中學課程，對個別小六學生及時作出適切的學習支援，學校與兩所屬會中學共同合作，為中一新生提供各種銜接課程及活動。

在課程銜接方面，本校課程主任及中、英、數、常四科的科主任均定期與屬會中學同工進行會議，檢視有關的學習階段的課程內容，從而作出適當的調整及剪裁，務求令學生的學習經歷銜接更順暢。

學與教

學與教是學校最重要的職能，是學校最基本、最核心的工作，因此亦是學校長期的核心發展項目。本年度，學校重點關注教師在課堂如何運用學習策略及提問技巧，以提升學生的學習動機、提升教師的教學能量，強化教與學的質素。

配合關注事項「培養學生良好的學習習慣及提升學生學習動機，以促進學生有效學習。」，本校推行「自主簿」計畫，透過每天於導修課練習書寫姿勢，並定期舉行美字比賽，鼓勵學生認真書寫中文字，表揚認真書寫的學生。本年度本校更嘗試於上學期試後舉行「體驗學習周」，為全校一至六年級學生設計五天的跨學科課程，提供豐富的體驗學習經歷，讓學生「走出課堂」，例如以環保物料設計服飾、運用平板電腦製作短片等。「體驗學習周」推行成功，得到教師、家長、學生的充分肯定，能有效提升學生的學習動機。



在體驗學習活動中，學生自行搜集物料，學習縫紉技巧，設計並製作自己的環保服飾。



在級本生命教育活動「感恩我擁有」中，同學嘗試模擬雙手殘障人士，運用雙腳寫字。

此外，本校的「校本生命教育課程」已進入第三年，發展日趨成熟，更與成長課及德育及公民教育課程更緊密結合。本年度，生命教育組同事繼續為課程作出增潤，設計每級的級本生命教育活動，以體驗式的學習活動讓學生提升個人素養，培養學生實踐正面、積極的人生觀。另外，生命教育小組在一至四年級開展生命教育繪本課程，豐富了成長課的學習模式及德育主題。

中文科於本年度重點提升學生的閱讀興趣，首年在三、四年級推展「必讀書計劃」，配合電子平台、資料搜集及戲劇教育，教師以引領思維的教學模式教授學生必讀書的內容。活動結束後，仍看到學生將必讀書於早讀課及其他時間閱讀，可見學生的閱讀興趣得到提升。

英文科一直致力為學生創造運用英語的語境，故設計了多元化的英文學習活動，包括English Fun Fair、Reading Buddies及World Book Day，讓學生走出課室，在輕鬆愉快的環境下學習英語，增加閱讀量，以提升學生的學習興趣。本年度更為一年級引入了Space Town課程，課程包含唱遊、拼音、閱讀英文課外書及電子圖書等，以強化一年級學生的英文語境。另外，我們繼續培養學生的寫作習慣，增加學生運用英語表達自己的能力。

數學科重點關注推行「電子教學」，在課堂中引入iPad及電子書進行教學，並運用不同的應用程式以豐富教學策略，讓教師能即時跟進學生的學習表現，及時作出回饋。在設計課業時，教師更聚焦於課業中的數學化語言及應用題的應用，藉此增加學生的解難能力及幫助學生掌握數學的獨特思考模式。

常識科重點在校本課程中加入STEM元素，引入mBot及編程課程，以培養學生的邏輯思維能力及解難能力。另外，配合各種與常識課題相關的小實驗，帶出公平測試及實驗的進行原則及步驟，以了解不同的科學原理，從收集及分析實驗數據中作出各種結論。

在培育方面，本校繼續推行「一人一服務」計畫，讓全校的高年級生均有貢獻自己的機會，進一步發揮「修己善群」的精神。本校更為全校的服務生提供領袖訓練計劃，建立學生的自信心、責任感和領導才能。本年度更優化了「好學生計畫」，以教育學生建立正確的公民價值觀及公正的投票態度。

教師專業發展

要提升學與教的效能，首要考慮的就是教師的專業能力和水平。學校一直積極為教師提供持續專業進修的機會，建立優秀的教師團隊。

在英文科方面，本年度參與由教育局的Literacy Programmes，引入Space Town課程，以發展小一的英文科課程，主要目的是透過自主學習及電子學習，強化一年級學生的英文能力。

數學科參加由教育局統籌的「專業交流學習圈小組」，與其他友校教師建立交流平台，共同探究如何利用平板電腦的輔助作電子學習，更有效建構完整的數學概念，以充實四年級的數學課程，並把相關的教學經驗及成果擴展至其他年級進行。

在常識科方面，四年級科任參加由教育局舉辦的「STEM活動初探」課程，與其他參與的學校共同備課及觀課，以研究如何在小學常識課程中融入STEM教學，增強課程中的STEM元素及編程的元素，培養學生的創意思維、解難能力。

此外，辦學團體當中不少教育界專家亦經常舉辦工作坊及講座，多方面支援教師，為教師提供新的教學方法及對課程作出反思。透過一條龍政策，更加強了屬會學校之間的觀課及議課，令彼此對中小學的課程銜接、教學法及學生需要等作專業分析及調適。



學生表現

除了學科知識的增長外，學校亦重視學生的不同學習經歷。為此學校提供了多元化的延展活動，於平日的課後時間、週末及長假期開辦不同類型的課餘興趣班，由專業導師執教。學生在整個小學階段均能參與五個不同範疇的活動，包括：文化藝術、康樂體育、社會服務/實踐、學術活動及生活技能。此外，學校透過安排學生參加不同種類的校外比賽，使學生寓比賽於學習，以自我提升的心態，延展所學。

在2017-2018學年，本校各科/組舉辦的延展活動合共超過90項，無論在參與人數和獲取的獎項方面均有理想的表現。在本學年參與各項校外比賽的學生有1118人次，主要包括有學術類287人次、藝術類218人次和體育類613人次。

而在各項比賽中，學生均有優秀的表現，獲獎的類別和數目如下：

學術類的獎項：冠軍4個、亞軍1個、季軍2個、其他獎項106個

藝術類的獎項：冠軍4個、亞軍6個、其他獎項44個

體育類的獎項：冠軍22個、亞軍24個、季軍25個、殿軍11個、其他獎項13個

學生在不同的範疇均有優秀的表現。在體育範疇的整體表現出色，其中欖球、田徑、花式跳繩、舞蹈的表現尤其突出，多次在元朗區及全港性的校際比賽中獲取獎項。而在學術範疇中，中、英、普的朗誦的表現也很突出，而普通話集誦隊更在香港學校朗誦節中奪得冠軍。

家校合作

學校與家長是教育孩子的好夥伴，所以本校一向重視家校合作。家教會自一九九三年成立，從當時的雛型發展至今天的成熟期，家教會已有非常精確嚴密的組織，家長與教師理事定期開會，為學校各方面的發展作出支援及協助。家教會會員樂於參加學校為他們舉辦的各種親子講座、工作坊及康樂活動。家長們組成龐大的家長義工團隊，發揮家校合作的功能，協助學校推行各種學習活動，截至本學年6月中，共有133位家長曾經參加本校的義工工作，達841服務人次，總時數達到2200小時。家校合作從二十多年前推展至今天的成就，實有賴各家長的付出與貢獻。

前言

學校已度過廿五個年頭，過去一年，在法團校董會的帶領下，加上教職員的努力，家長的支持和信任，共同協力為同學營造積極、正面和關懷的學習環境，不論在學與教、延展課程、品德培育、資訊科技發展與照顧個別差異方面，均取得良好的成績，現簡略報告如下：

學與教方面

本校的課程設計及教師教學效能一向深獲學界同工認同及欣賞。本年度，我們在原有基礎上，繼續以「培養學生自主學習能力」為主要發展項目，在不同科目進行自主學習能力培訓，包括增加課前預習、改變堂課及家課的模式、增加課堂電子學習元素、推行跨課程閱讀等等。本校亦與各大專業教育機構合作，開發不同的課程，包括參加中文大學的優質學校改進計劃，優化學校的發展規劃及自評文化。中文科參與教育大學趙志成教授主持的自主學習教學研習圈，與友校互相交流。英文科與教育局外籍英語教師組合作無間，本年度三年級參加以自主學習為題的SpaceTown讀寫教學計劃，透過有趣的故事書及課堂活動，令同學對學習英語充滿興趣，教師亦能更適切跟進同學的進度，作出更適切的回饋。而常識科、電腦科亦參加浸信會沙田圍呂明才小學的優質教育基金主題網絡計劃，為小四的STEM課程注入mBot及編程的新元素，在提升學生學習動機及探究精神上取得極佳的成果。

經同事的努力，各項課程發展均有顯著成效，各科均獲邀向其他小學分享成功經驗，並獲得各界高度評價，對本校教師專業精神給予嘉許和肯定。

良好的學科基礎令本校同學在不同的校外學術比賽中獲得肯定，在中、英文及數理方面均奪得多項全港性大獎。由於同學成績優異，表現出色，因此有一位同學在元朗鄉議局中學主辦的元朗區傑出小學生選舉中獲優異獎，一位同學獲元朗區校長會頒發傑出小學生獎，一位獲頒學生飛躍表現獎，成績令人鼓舞。

延展課程方面

學校的延展課程目標是「擴闊視野，追求卓越」。為讓不同能力的同學均有發展潛能、受訓及表演的機會，學校安排不同的同學參加各類型校隊訓練及擔任小司儀或導賞員，並在早會、綜合成果展、校園接待等活動中給同學鍛鍊的機會，讓同學有多元化的學習經歷，培養他們在不同領域發展個人潛能，建立自信。

本年度全校學生共795位學生，但參加校外比賽人次超過1160人，超過730人次獲獎。當中不少同學都是首次代表學校參賽，以汲取經驗，更有不少首次參賽已獲獎，而獎項涉及音樂、視覺藝術及體育等多個範疇，對學校和同學都起了很大的鼓勵作用。

在藝術方面，伊分弦樂團表現日趨成熟。此外，本年度繼續設立合唱團和民歌隊，同學在校內及校外均表現出色，除在比賽中獲得優良成績外，合唱團更與辦學團體長者學苑合唱團合作，作公開演出，實行長幼共融，演出大獲好評。視覺藝術方面，同學在多項全港性的填色、繪畫及創作比賽獲多項獎項，發揮創意之餘，也贏得不少掌聲。學校二十五周年的校慶典禮中，弦樂團、合唱團及視藝科設計的環保機械人表演，充分反映同學的藝術水平和創意，令嘉賓留下深刻印象。

至於校園電視台，繼續憑著優秀的編、導、演技巧、創新的拍攝手法，在過去一年勇奪全港多項公開及校際影片大獎，成績令人鼓舞。除拍攝電視節目外，電視台更銳意發展教師、學生及家長培訓，包括設立教師種籽計劃，鼓勵老師自行製作教學節目或預習影片，以配合自主學習。下學期更推行「借個電視台俾你用」計劃，教學生、家長拍攝及剪接技巧。

在體育方面，本年度足球隊繼續屢獲殊榮，並有四位隊員入選元朗區地區代表(U13)，另兩位更代表元朗區小學參加全港學界足球比賽。此外，同學在手球、小型網球、舞蹈、跆拳道、武術、體操及游泳等項目上，同樣獲多項冠、亞、季、優異獎及團體大獎。另外在長跑、欖球、單車、辯論、機械人等項目亦取得突破性獎項，成績令人驚喜。由於同學於體育及藝術方面表現出色，多位同學獲得外間機構頒發獎學金，以茲鼓勵，包括六位同學獲王威信體學兼優獎勵計劃、一位同學當選元朗文藝之星，一位同學獲屈臣氏香港學生運動員獎。更有兩位同學獲頒柏立基爵士信託基金傑出學生資助獎學金。

同學能在課外活動方面取得卓越的成就，實有賴教師團隊的承擔與努力，家長們的鼎力支持，與及同學們的積極參與。

品德培育方面

學校一向致力培養學生在學術、才藝及品德情意各方面有均衡而全面的發展，實踐校訓：「修己善群」的精神。本年度，學校加入正向教育元素，以24種正向性格為骨幹，重整各級成長課。

在班級經營方面，各級教師透過定期的班級經營會及個案跟進會，有效掌握同學的情況，及早制定預防措施，同時又積極商討各項培育政策，並探討如何為教師提供適切的支援。結果除了令同學更守規外，教師亦更認同並投入培育工作。此外，我們又透過服務學習、大哥哥大姐姐計劃(例如：一六大聯盟、愛心小天使等)，營造和諧而關愛的校園文化。

我們明白品德情意的培育單以言教已不合時宜，單調乏味的教材及教學模式亦難引起同學共鳴，因此校園電視以成熟的師生製作團隊，在培育組成長課的穩固基礎上，以具創意的手法製作一系列「伊分德育劇場」，透過生動活潑的形式吸引學生，甚至家長觀看，讓大家反思生活細節中如何培養品德情意。此外，本校一位同學雖然是長期病患者，但仍能自強不息，一直保持優異成績，因此奪得「第四屆衍生獎學金」。我們深信在師生和家長的努力下，必能培育品學兼優，德才兼備的青少年。

資訊科技與照顧個別差異方面

為更有效照顧不同能力學生的學習需要，學校在部分級別以分流學習形式安排不同能力的學生進行主科學習，讓教師可因應同學的能力及進度進行針對性輔導，結果令人滿意，不論高能力或能力稍遜同學均有明顯進步。本學年，學校得到教育局撥款、姊妹學校試驗計劃津貼，加上有校董的支持，與及家教會協助籌募發展經費，我們已進一步完善網絡基建設施，配合電子工具的運用，有助提升學與教效能，亦有助教師進行即時評估與回饋，並為2018-2019學年推行BYOD計劃做好充分準備。此外，學校改建了資訊科技學習中心，並配合課程增購不少STEM設備，包括3D打印機、VR設備、智能積木、不插電編程遊戲，以及micro:bit電腦版，並引入mBot及編程（coding）為核心課程，不但令同學對科研興趣大增，也令學習模式、內容更活潑及多樣化，大大提升了學習的動機之餘，亦讓同學發揮不同能力，教師能更全面評估學生各方面的學習能力與成效，以調整教學方向及步伐。

完善教學環境

為配合學校發展，與及同學的學習模式，學校裝修了全新的英語室及資訊科技學習中心，又把三樓電腦室改裝成多元化學習室和輔導室，其中一個工友宿舍改建為學生體能訓練中心，另外一個宿舍則多謝部分辦學團體成員捐贈及建議，建設成學生生活學習中心及遊戲室。學生在全新的，具創意及靈活調動空間的課室內進行不同形式的學習，大大提升了學習動機，也增加了師生和生生互動，對學與教均有極大裨益。

總結

「同心共度廿五載，邁步跨進新紀元」是學校二十五周年的口號，也是實況。學校在良好和穩健的基礎上不斷突破，致力提升學與教的水平，又為學生提供全面的發展機會，並培養學生良好的品德情意。學校小一收生情況與家長口碑與日俱升，反映出區內家長對學校的支持和信任。學校取得美滿成果，實在有賴校董會在財政及專業發展上的支援，教師和職工團隊的努力和付出。我們期望在各方努力下，繼續打造高效的學習環境，讓同學可以感受到正面、積極、關懷的學校文化，並健康和愉快地成長。

Staff Strength

Our school has a strong and professional teaching team. Among the teaching staff, 65% are higher degree holders and the remaining 35% are degree holders. About 80% have more than 10 years of teaching experience. All teachers have been professionally trained -- 16% have had training in Special Education; and all teachers of English Language and Putonghua have met the respective requirements of the Language Proficiency Assessment. In Physical Education, our PE teachers were awarded the Certificate of Merit of Chief Executive's Award for Teaching Excellence of 2017-2018.

Public Examination Results

We are proud of the performance of our students in the 2018 Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education (HKDSE) Examination. Among the 150 students who sat for the Examination, 92% met the general requirements for sub-degree programmes (i.e. Level 2 in 5 subjects including Chinese Language and English Language) and 51.3% met the minimum entrance requirements for undergraduate programmes (i.e. Level 3 in 2 subjects and Level 2 in 2 subjects, or "3-3-2-2", for the 4 core subjects). The average credit rate (i.e. attaining Level 4 or above) was 36.3%. There were 12 subjects with higher credit rate than the Hong Kong average; they included Chinese Language, Mathematics, Liberal Studies, Chinese Literature, Economics, Geography, History, Tourism and Hospitality Studies, BAFS (Management stream), Information and Communication Technology, Visual Arts and Physical Education. 41 students obtained 20 marks or above in their best five subjects. Over 90% of our 2017-2018 graduates received offers from higher education institutions. Among them, 63 students received offers via Joint University Programmes Admissions System (JUPAS).



English Learning

English is a key learning area in our school. We aim to help students develop their English proficiency through a language-rich environment. In addition to the NET (Native-speaking English Teacher) under existing staff establishment, 2 more school-based NETs were recruited to bring in more English learning opportunities. Our students are provided with plenty of learning experience to practise and use English. English as medium of instruction (EMI) classes are offered in junior forms. Lesson time in English has increased progressively for subjects such as Science, Mathematics, Geography, Computer Literacy and Visual Arts. Our speech days, graduation ceremonies and sports days are conducted in English. To enhance students' learning interest, e-learning has been introduced with all junior form students equipped with i-Pads for lessons. To promote reading, an Extensive Reading Scheme has been introduced. It incorporates a regular reading and speaking lesson into the S1 and S2 curricula. English related extended activities included the intensive 3-week English immersion camp held in summer, the 2-week English Remedial Programme for our S1 and S2 students, and the Through-train English Games Day participated by the 4 EPO schools;. We also work with our primary schools to align the primary and secondary English curriculum. All these are done in the hope that our students will become more confident in using English and enjoy their language learning experience.

School Activities to Broaden Students' Horizons

With the strong support from the Queen Elizabeth School Old Students' Association, and the networks we have established with different sectors of society, our students were able to break through geographical and cultural barriers and pursue learning opportunities in mainland China and other parts of the world. In 2017-2018, cross-border learning activities included a cultural study tour to Kaiping for all S2 students, a cultural exchange tour to a sister school in Beijing, a science camp to Shanghai, a tree-planting project in Inner-Mongolia and an annual Caretakers of the Environment International (CEI) conference in Vienna.

Awards

Our students continued to have remarkable performance in various open competitions. Academically, our debating team was the champion of the Yuen Long Tuen Mun Secondary School Debating Competition organised by Lingnan University. In mathematics, our students were awarded several First Class prizes in the Pan-Asia Pacific International Mathematics Invitation Competition and the Third Class Award of Asia International Mathematical Olympiad Open Contest. Our students also obtained the Second Prize in English Choral speaking (Secondary 1 and 2, mixed voices) in the Hong Kong Speech Festival.

In addition, we had a fruitful year in arts and music competitions. We won the Gold Award in the 46th Hong Kong Dance Competition. We were awarded the Gold Award in the painting category in the Hong Kong Secondary Schools Visual Arts Display (2017-2018).

In sports, our students were outstanding in territory-wide competitions and were granted opportunities to participate in international events in swimming, rugby and handball. Our school won various awards in rope-skipping competitions, Hong Kong inter-school football, volleyball competitions and a number of track and field events.

Conclusion

With the constant challenges ahead, we will keep striving to provide the best learning environment for our students, to equip them with the skills required in the ever-changing society and to enable them to develop their talents to the fullest.

Staff Strength

Our teaching staff consisted of 61 teachers, above the standard established staff number granted by the Education Bureau. 100% of the teachers employed have received their first undergraduate degree, 62% of them hold higher degrees, and 100% are professionally trained. Moreover, all English teachers have attained the language proficiency qualification as required by the Education Bureau.

Class Structure

There were four classes in each form from S1 to S6. To maximize the learning outcomes and increase overall student performance, especially for students with learning challenges, small class teaching was implemented in junior forms. Under this arrangement, teachers were more able to effectively measure student performance, and tailor their teaching strategies to better cater for the diverse needs of students, thereby improving student achievement.

Student-centred Curriculum Support

The school adopted a whole school pastoral care policy, focusing on a school culture based on the values of respect and positivity. A dual class-teacher system was adopted to help students to have a balanced development in their academic and moral aspects. Motivational talks by teachers and students during morning assemblies and Personal, Social and Health Education lessons and cross subject curricula were employed to develop the students' values and sense of citizenship. The school emphasized the importance of a balanced physical and mental development, of learning diligently, and of striving for excellence.

We encouraged all students to participate in various activities to broaden their horizons and develop their full potential. A wide variety of activities including STEM Education Camp, Chinese debate competition, Career Education Camps, dance and drama performances, uniform group training and school team practice, were arranged for students to explore their interests and talents.

We adopted a whole school approach to cater for learning diversity. We formulated comprehensive strategies, provided thorough support to students and applied timely evaluation. Remedial classes in Chinese, English and Mathematics were offered to S1 and S2 students; after-school language programmes for non-Chinese speaking students and students with special educational needs were arranged; career guidance and life planning programmes were run to guide students to make a life plan to achieve their career goals; school-based speech therapy and professional assessments from educational psychologist were provided, and training in social skills and self-management skills were rendered. We hired extra teachers, counsellors and teaching assistants to make sure that our students at all academic levels could benefit from the above arrangements.

English Enrichment Initiatives

To help students develop their English language skills, the school undertook different measures to improve learning and to encourage a passion for learning English. The school offered small class sizes to allow for greater interaction between students and teachers, and after school enhancement classes to assist students in danger of falling behind and to allow exceptional students an opportunity to expand their language skills. In addition, we offered a wide range of English language activities and theme events, as well as competitions that took advantage of students' natural competitive spirit. These activities included cooking competition, story-telling competition, Through-train English Games Day, debate competition, drama appreciation, Hong Kong Schools Speech Festival, inter-school oral practice, Thursday vocabulary teaching, English Phonetic course, creative writing course and overseas study tours. The in-class learning and the extracurricular activities served to complement each other and provide a rich English environment to enhance students' confidence and their proficiency in English.

2017-2018 Highlights and Achievements

Regarding the 2018 Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education Examination, the overall passing rate was 60%. Our students performed remarkably in academic competitions. One S1 student got the first runner-up in the Chinese Prose Recitation Competition. In debating, one S5 student won the Best Debater Award in the Inter-school Debate Competition. A total of 27 students took part in the 69th Hong Kong Speech Festival (English Speech). One came first and one came second, 16 attained merits and 6 attained proficiency. In the field of mathematics, our students earned 12 credits and 14 merits in the University of New South Wales (Australia) Global International Competition and Assessment. In addition, one S3 student was the second runner-up in the Mathematics Olympiad. Four students won the championship in the Hong Kong Secondary Innovation and Technology Competition. Additionally, two S5 students were awarded the championship in the Model Hovercraft Making Competition. Three students won the championship in the Robot Racing Contest.

Students also performed well in the domain of art last year. The Joint Schools Music Competition result was fruitful, with our students earning 2 gold, 10 silver and 10 bronze awards in the event. Our students got 5 merit and 3 credit awards in the Hong Kong School Music Festival. The brass band was also awarded the championship in the district competition. One S5 student was awarded the first runner-up in the Schools Dance Festival. Six students got the Certificate of Appreciation and a merit in the Healthy School Drama Competition. One S1 student won second place, third place twice and a merit in the Traditional Chinese Martial Arts Competition.

Our athletes won championships in the areas of softball, triple jump, high jump, rugby and football. As for individual awards, 6 students earned Most Valuable Team Members Awards in the rugby games. Eleven students were invited to join the Hong Kong Rugby team. One S6 student earned recognition in the A.S. Watson Group Hong Kong Student Sports Awards.

Conclusions

The real value of education lies in its potential to broaden students' mind. We are committed to helping students realize their potentials and gain knowledge through personal development of physical, social, intellectual, and emotional abilities.
