

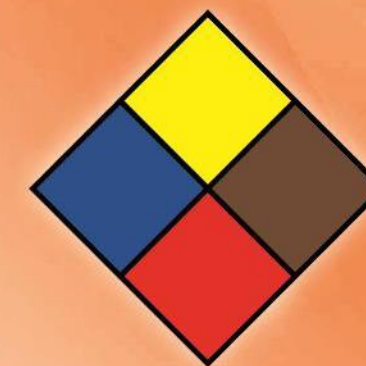

Message from Chairman of QESOSA

Dear Fellow Alumni,

The year 2018-2019 was the 65th anniversary year of Queen Elizabeth School. In the early part of 2019, QES, QES PTA and OSA were working together enthusiastically on the celebration activities. With the development of the social activities, the task of OSA had gradually changed to deciding on whether or not we should continue with the planned activities.



Among the decisions OSA made, the most difficult one was the postponement of the QES65 Gala Dinner. Alumni were disappointed by the decision, especially the overseas ones, who had been looking forward to this memorable moment and the precious opportunity of meeting with old friends. However, I am sure alumni would understand that the safety of alumni, students and friends is always the highest priority of OSA. OSA has been working closely with QES to have the 65th Anniversary activities moved to the 2020-2021 school year. I sincerely hope the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic would ease off by then, and alumni could freely enjoy the celebration activities.

With all the uncertainties in 2019, OSA strived to maintain a good QES-alumni relationship. In 2018-19, OSA continued to support QES students to take an overseas study tour to broaden their learning experience. The 3 sponsorship recipients took a study tour to University of Cambridge, UK in July 2019.

Besides participating in the QES Homecoming Day (16 March 2019), alumni also took part in the sports events of QES. I am proud to report that at the QES Sports Day, our 3 alumni teams swept the board in the 4 x 50m invitation relay and, at the QES Swimming Gala, the alumni team won the champion for the 4 x 50m invitation relay.

As regards the Ball Game Tournaments (BGT) 2019, the football, basketball and volleyball tournaments attracted 540 participant counts in the 115 matches played. The convening of the BGT 2019 was tough. Adding to the postponement resulting from the maintenance of the basketball court from January 2019 - March 2019, the bad weather further delayed the schedule of the ball games. Thanks to the dedicated efforts of Eric Cheung (75FA), the BGT conveners and the volunteers as well as the patience of the players, all the matches were completed eventually in July 2019.

I would like to take this opportunity to express our gratitude to Principal Chan Cheung Wai and his team for involving OSA in the school activities and his support of OSA in our activities.

We do not have the printed version of the OSA 2019 Annual Report due to the fact that there was no channel for distribution after all the major activities were cancelled. With the belief that any form of communication is better than no communication, here is this electronic version of the OSA 2019 Annual Report.

2019 was a bumpy year. I would like to express my heartfelt thanks to our fellow alumni for their contribution and understanding. Last but not least, my fellow Executive Committee members, your support and comradeship has provided me with the strength to tackle the unprecedented challenges in the past year. Thank you!

Message from Chairman of QESOSAEPO

Dear Fellow Alumni,

QESOSA EPO is a school sponsoring body operating 2 primary schools and 2 secondary schools, all situated in Tin Shui Wai, New Territories.

2018-2019 marked the new 3-year plan cycle of the 4 schools. Our schools took the opportunity to thoroughly review the previous 3-year plans and conduct situational analyses for devising their new plans.

In the coming 3 years, both our primary schools would place special emphasis on positive education (正向教育) – to help students discover, nurture and utilize their character strengths and potentials so that they could better cope with their stress and challenges in daily life and, eventually lead to a prosperous life. One of the major concerns of our secondary schools was to address the learning diversity of students. A whole school approach would be adopted. Besides taking advantage of the flexibility of e-learning and using pull-out classes, the schools also hired additional staff such as teachers, counsellors and teaching assistants to cater for the learning needs of students at all academic levels.

The 4 schools continued to optimize their STEM elements education with the foundation built up over the past few years. The focus was on integrating STEM into various subjects. As for English learning, the schools carried on their work to develop the language proficiency of students by creating a language-rich environment. Various English activities, namely fun fair, drama, English study tour were organized to enhance the interest of students in learning English. For moral and civic education, our teachers were well aware of the importance to help students cultivate the qualities of a good citizen - to abide by the law, to think critically and to respect the opinions of others.

EPO formed a Professional Development Team as resource personnel and support to help our schools enhance their effectiveness and quality of the learning and teaching process in 2016. Last year, the Team together with the schools pioneered on developing the instructional leadership skill of mid-level management using the Danielson Framework. The schools has made good progress with the initiative, both in terms of quantity and quality. In 2018-2019, there were more teachers who became increasingly proficient as an instruction leader.

The QESOSA Education Services branch of EPO provides 2 education programmes for the Tin Shui Wai community. The Elder Academy offers classes to encourage life-long learning of the elders. The Academy also aims at promoting inter-generational harmony. QESOSA Secondary School students participated by conducting classes for the elders and organizing sustainable tours for them. The other education programme is Capacity Building Mileage Programme (CBMP). When EPO joined CBMP in 2008, one of our objectives was to provide our own parents with a platform for continuous education, thus setting a role model for their children. In 2018-2019, about half of the CBMP participants were the parents of EPO school students.

We are experiencing a time of paradigm shift. In the foreseeable future, uncertainties will become the new normal. I am nonetheless positive that with the astute leadership of our principals, the commitment of our professional teaching staff and the endless support from our parents together, we can continue to provide “for our students a positive and caring environment that will enable them to have healthy and balanced physical, cognitive, and psycho-social development” as stated in our mission.

Message from QES Principal

On the Shoulders of Giants

It has been a privilege for me to have collected fond memories of collaborating with colleagues, students, alumni and parents of the school last year. I can reminisce my feelings of being challenged when learning the news of being appointed to hold the helm of this renowned vessel. QES has undoubtedly made a name for herself since its foundation years under the nurturing of our former visionary principals and colleagues. With their wholehearted and collective efforts, the school today continues to hold itself in high esteem, fostering children to become responsible young adults, and helping them to acquire admirable and scholastic qualities.

In mid-September last year, Super Typhoon Mangkhut struck Hong Kong as raging winds and torrential rain spread through the city, leaving a path of destruction in their wake and the suspension of many schools including QES. However, with the invaluable and steadfast support from the ancillary staff, our school was soon able to resume its daily operations. Unfortunately, a considerable number of heritage trees in our school campus and Sai Kung campsite felt the brunt of the typhoon and had to be felled. It was, therefore, heart-rending to see these magnificent giants that had witnessed more than six decades of the graduation of our cohorts and development of our school being hewn down.

In the first year of the three-year school development plan, our teachers toiled away to achieve the following two targets: (1) further enhance students' learning capacity and teachers' collaboration and (2) nurture students to be contributing members of the community in a caring and loving school environment. An evaluation of our school plans reveals our current state of performance, our strengths, development priorities and targets for improvement. The ultimate aim for QES is to provide all-round quality education and lifelong learning for our students so they can attain academic excellence.

It was just eight years ago when I first visited QES to meet Pr. Tong who, surprisingly, was also my A-level English teacher in my high school days. As a football enthusiast, I was also attracted to the school's newly overhauled football pitch, a much cherished green space surrounded by beautiful deciduous and evergreen trees. Remarkably, I still remember Pr. Tong's meaningful explanation of our school's motto '*Vos Parate Ut Serviatis*' and his remark that 'QES is a quality education school with quality educated teachers and quality educated students'.

Besides the school's motto, my first encounter of the QES spirit was derived from the lyrics of the school song composed by Professor Briton Edmund Blunden in 1955. '*Thankful soul*', '*loving thought*', '*shining dream*', '*serve the world*' and '*spread the light*', are ever inspiring words that have established important core values in the hearts and minds of QES students over the past six decades. Such spiritual values can doubtlessly be observed from our prominent alumni with whom I have met this year. As members of various respectable professions, our alumni manifest these core values in their performance at work and in their valuable contributions to society. They have, indeed, established a strong foundation in the QES Alumni Mentorship Programme. Their successful promotion of the programme evidently demonstrates their strong attachment to their alma mater and genuine care for our students today. Not only do they introduce their own professions to our students, but they also provide invaluable workplace visits and other learning opportunities for them. This year, I witnessed a very strong bonding between thousands of alumni and their alma mater at various school activities throughout the school year.

My most memorable and rewarding experience of life in QES has been my first visit to the Sai Kung School Camp held on 10 November 2018. Students from S.1 expressed much enthusiasm in learning to folk dance from our alumni, and actively discussed with senior camp wardens on the renovation of our school. On that day, I was also able to witness the ever-lasting spirit that has united the souls of campers over the past six decades; I learned about the campsite's indispensable role in helping the campers to approach matters holistically.

On 14 November 2018, one of my peers of the principalship course, Mr. Tse Chun Hung (98 FA), graced our Sports Day by being the guest of honour. As an Economics teacher at QESOSA Tong Kwok Wah Secondary School, Mr. Tse holds a stunning record of six Hong Kong race walking awards. In his speech, he concluded his experience of the competitive, long-distance sport by interpreting the three letters for QES - 'Q' for Quality, 'E' for Effectiveness, and 'S' for Self-discipline. By using these words of wisdom which have had a profound effect on his life, Mr Tse inspired our students and guided them towards the importance of lifelong learning and long term planning.

Message from QES Principal

Our Annual Speech Day held on 30 November 2019 was honoured by the presence of our alumnus, Professor Lam Hon Ming (78FA), as our Guest of Honour, to present the scholarships and prizes to the recipients. Professor Lam has worked on soybean research for more than 2 decades, and his strive for achieving enhanced crops' adaptation to adverse conditions continues today. Additionally, his enthusiasm in promoting STEM education in Hong Kong has initiated various enrichment seminars and activities for secondary school teachers and students. He shared his own stories in his speech "Uphill Battles for Dream Seekers" with the ending remarks, "*Embrace hardship and challenges*", "*If it is hard to make big changes, start with small ones*", "*Build a support network of like-minded people*" and "*Have a thankful mind*". Through his considerable experience on the hardships of life, Professor Lam gave hope and strength to our junior students, to fight their own uphill battles and to bring their dreams to fruition.



In the Swimming Gala held on 14 December 2018, our school was fortunate to have our alumnus and the Chairman of Hong Kong Swimming Teachers' Association, Dr. Patrick Yeung Chee To (59 FA), as our guest of honour. In 1957, he established the QES Life Saving Club, an affiliated unit of the Hong Kong Lifeguard Club and the Royal Life. He first served as an assistant instructor, then as the Club's Chairman and President in 1958 and 1959 respectively. Our heartfelt gratitude goes to Dr. Yeung for officiating the prize-giving ceremony and sharing with us his fruitful days at QES.

Equally important were the events organised by the OSA in the last academic year. The Ball Game Tournaments on Sundays from mid-November 2018 to March 2019 gathered sports lovers on our campus again. Not only did these tournaments revive the scenes of students partaking in ball games nearly every day in QES, but they also connected various generations of alumni through matches of friendship. The end of the tournaments fell on Homecoming Day on 16 March 2019, when alumni and their families celebrated their reunion with various ball games and the children-adoring bouncy castle and slide.

The financial support through numerous donations and sponsorships from OSA and alumni is indubitably worth noting. Besides subsidizing school activities such as the Student Union Lunar New Year Fair 2019, the OSA sponsored \$100,000 for an eye-opening and educational trip to Cambridge, in the UK, in July 2019 and 3 students benefited from the sponsorship. The OSA also donated \$100,000 to the School Camp Development and Maintenance Fund for the future development of the School Camp. In addition, we are also grateful to the lavish donations from our alumni, coordinated by 66FA, to set up a "Walter Ng Memorial Fund" which awards our students with "Best Improvement in English" and "Outstanding Contribution to School Drama" to commemorate our former teacher Mr. Walter Ng. To conclude, without our alumni's generous support, QES would not have reaped another year of success, and students would not have enjoyed extensive learning opportunities. Once again, I wish to express my sincerest gratitude to our unwavering supporters.

On the shoulders of giants, I am highly privileged to be a baton-catcher in the reply race of school development. To sustain the edge that all the visionary principals have achieved in our school's enhancement, it is now my mission to lead our passionate staff and high-quality students to maintaining the glory and success that generations of alumni have attained, and to establish various platforms and ladders for QES students so they may aim higher and see further than others.

伊中舞聚2019年回顧

舞聚場地及參與者

又一年了，自2015年秋伊中舞聚開始，至今已五周歲了，而參與者還是非常雀躍，每次都興高采烈地出席。

過去四年的「伊中舞聚」多能不定期地租借地方頗偏遠但交通方便及設備較簇新的體育館，如西貢區的調景嶺、坑口及將軍澳體育館，進行連續三至四小時的舞聚；接著，Anson麥明新(72FA)開始為大家於每星期天借用紅磡社區會堂舉行定期的舞聚，只有社區會堂被徵用作「避寒」、「避暑」、「避雨」中心的日子例外，舞聚時間也由初時兩小時到後期延長至三小時。Anson (72 級聯麥明新) 都努力為大家借用紅磡社區會堂作為舞聚之用。我們更成功申請成為法定團體【伊舞樂】(EzA Dance)，以方便租借其他社區場地作舞聚。

在過去的一年中，出席舞聚的人數漸趨穩定，每次舞聚毋須預先報名，到時自然就會有些「基本」會員會出席，亦時有校友帶非伊中份子的嘉賓出席舞聚，我們本着“ The more the merrier”的精神，來者不拒，畢竟大家都是志同道合的土風舞愛好者，就算偶爾有比較多校友的親友參與也不違伊中校友舞聚主旨！

透過手機及網絡的魔力，不少土風舞發燒學友聞風而至，群組漸漸膨脹起來，到目前為止會員數目已超過八十人，橫跨50至80年代的級聯，儼然成為母校舊生會的常規活動！

推廣土風舞活動

過去四年，我們都不遺餘力地向現在就讀的學弟、學妹推廣這伊中優良傳統活動！我們積極參與伊中家長教師會在母校校營舉行「新生校營日」，在西貢校營青葱的草地上舉行舞聚，藉此向新生及家長推介土風舞。去年三月亦有繼續參與伊中舊生會舉行的「校友日」，在學校新翼五樓活動室舉行土風舞聚，不少就讀的學弟、學妹及一些從海外遠道回來的舊生也有出席，重拾昔日伊中土風舞的激情。除此之外，舞聚亦以【伊舞樂】(EzA Dance)的名義響應了去年世界舞蹈日的呼籲，在當日舉行了舞聚，28位參加者及【伊舞樂】都獲得香港舞蹈總會頒發證書，成為香港舞蹈界的一份子。

舞聚活動、安排及分工

一如既往，舞聚領舞小組繼續負責舞指工作，成員除了「皇上」黃仲基(69級聯)外，還有「安信兄弟」Andy 方奕霖 (76級聯)和Anson麥明新伉儷(72級聯)、King Kong劉昌富(74級聯)和舞姿優美，體態輕盈的Wing馮嘉詠(78級聯)的全情投入，他們為了增加大家對跳土風舞的興趣、加深認識世界各地不同的土風舞，都選了有趣、易學和優美的舞步，深入淺出引導大家學習，並加以小道具，如利用響鈴加強舞蹈的節拍和動感，利用絲巾、水袖和扇子，提升大家舞動的樂趣及技巧！

除了溫習熟悉的土風舞外，皇上還會在網上搜羅及趁出外旅遊時在旅途中學習一些簡單和節奏明快的舞蹈，介紹給我們；小安在年初亦曾介紹拉丁舞基礎練習步及解釋和示範拉丁舞動力和舞姿；大安伉儷則繼續肩負「主導舞指」重責，介紹了很多不同國家的民族舞；Wing比較喜歡東方舞，她給我們介紹了很多中國舞的基本舞步，並且提醒我們要跳得健康，要做好熱身以免關節受傷。King Kong 多數是做後勤、簽場、拍攝及錄影工作，每一次舞聚，他都是第一個到場，為我們拍攝舞聚相片及錄影花絮，讓未能參與該次舞聚的舞友，可以透過網上的分享自學。King Kong 還會在所有領舞者都無法出席時，肩負「後備舞指」的重任。

除了舞聚共舞之外，有時Wing及大安伉儷，會同場加開舞蹈表演，如西班牙舞、水袖舞、絲巾舞、羽扇舞，看得大家如痴如醉，拍爛手掌，影爆手機！

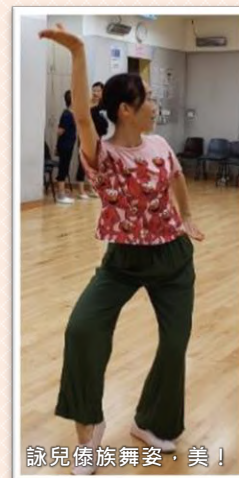

Then I started to join the conversation that provided me with a chance to speak English. Last but not least, UK study tour not only provided me with an opportunity to learn English, it also provided me with an opportunity to be independence. In the evening, I lived in a single room. So I need to take care of myself. Even, I need to wash the clothes by myself. At the same time, I think UK study tour gave me a lot of freedom. For example, I could sleep as late as I wanted, chat with my friends as frequent as I wanted, and do anything I liked in my room.

To conclude, I really enjoyed this tour and I even did not want to go back Hong Kong.

The More We Get Together 一起走過的日子

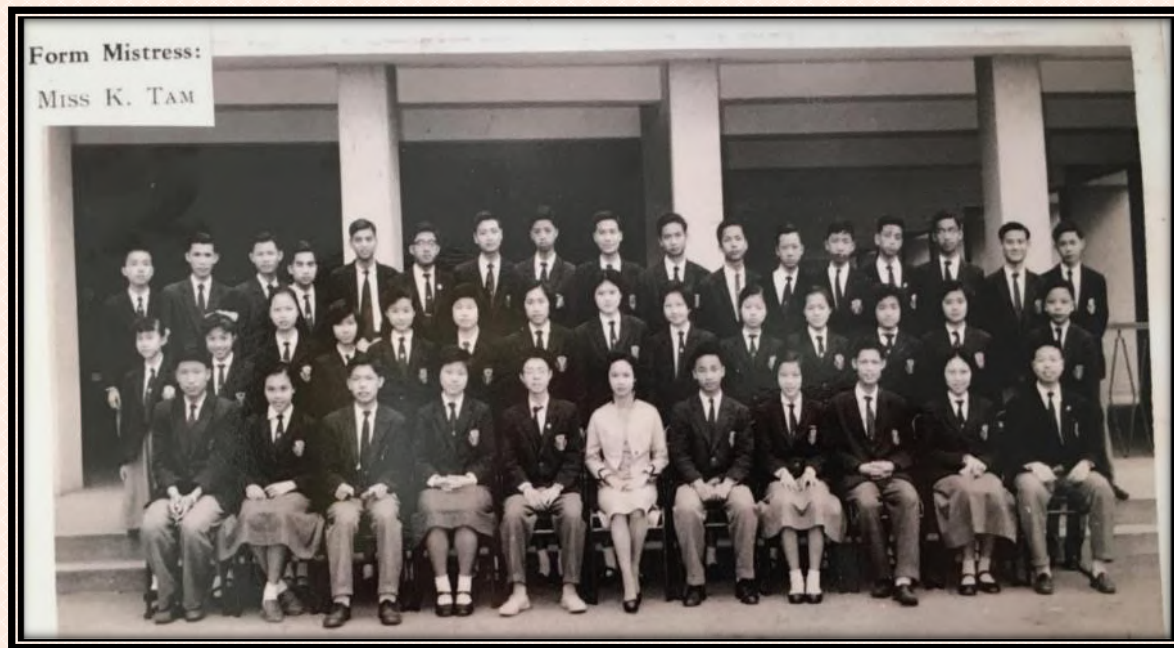

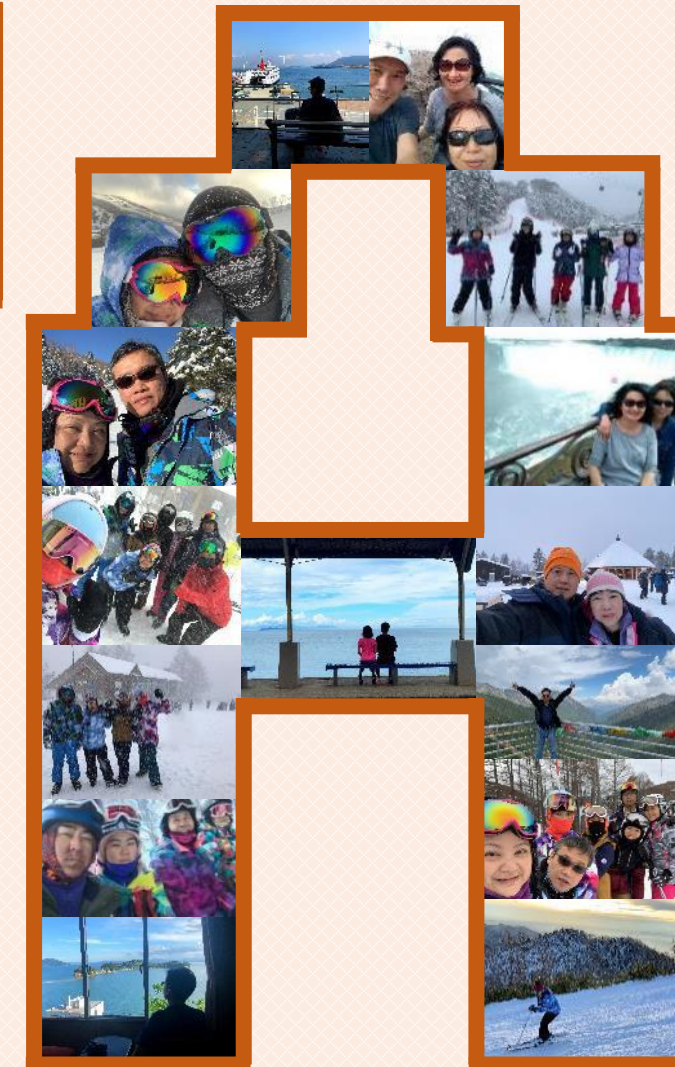

I could remember the event as clearly as if it happened yesterday. When I received the news that I was allocated to Queen Elizabeth School to study Form One in 1959, the whole family was overrun with joy. My mother brought this little proud Form one to the new school. I met my classmates who were also brought by their parents to this extraordinary event. Mr. Hinton, the new principal, was there to greet us and gave us the first speech that we would continue to listen weekly for seven more years. Worried that we might not be able to understand what the principal said, the senior master was there to translate the essentials to us. And this was the first time when we first met.

Fast forward sixty years. We are a group of septuagenarians with thinner and whiter hair, big tummies and have ploughed through life with various accomplishments in different situations, family establishments, becoming grandparents, or achieved distinction in social establishment. When we met, we were still the same group of kids that we first met.

Our beloved Hong Kong is besieged by social unrest not unlike the Boxer's uprising that began in 1899, sixty years prior to our starting Form One. The riots have prevented us from having our official dinner party to celebrate the sixty-fifth year of the establishment of the school, which was officially postponed to a more peaceful time. Our combatant spirit has prevented us from accepting the postponement, and we scheduled an afternoon tea-party to celebrate our sixty years of friendship, and to celebrate our lives of being able to be together for sixty years.

We met at 2:30 pm at the Grand Ballroom of Hilton Garden Inn on November 22. A total of 22 people participated, including alumni, spouse and friends. We were also there to celebrate the life of Fan Ho Chuen, a classmate who passed away abruptly a month prior to this meeting, and his widow and son were able to join us on this occasion in which we included how much we missed him as a friend, a classmate and a distinguished engineer who served in the government department of electrical and mechanical engineering.

Our choice of food, as suggested by the ubiquitous James Tang, is Chinese dimsum. We had a huge screen showing our lives as kids as secondary school students and our elderly eyes were still sharp to pick up who's who in those fading black-and-white

pictures. We smiled and laughed and temporarily forgot that we were elderly retirees. We also allocated time for everybody to speak, in a small aliquot of time, what happened during the years since we parted.

Life has been likened to a train ride. We boarded the same train, and we stayed together for some time, and we moved to other carriages and stayed with other people during the train ride. We all experienced the unpredictability of life. Things were so transient and ephemeral. It is because of the advances in technology that we were able to stay in one group in social media, and be together again after so many years. We suffer from losses, inevitably, and we mourn the passing away of our beloved friends. Nevertheless, we vowed to move ahead and be optimistic seniors, continuing to pursue whatever we treasure in life, until the time when we say good-bye.

CELEBRATING QUEEN ELIZABETH SCHOOL 65TH ANNIVERSARY IN CALIFORNIA

但在伊中最大的福氣是找到永恆的倚靠！信耶穌完全改變了我往後的際遇，也初度經歷神的大能；聖經說神是無所不能的，於是半信半疑地禱告求祂幫我，在模擬試中破天荒考得中史科第一名！連自己也不敢相信！可惜中七的大學入學試雖然合格，卻未能順利進入我朝思暮想的港大，感覺空前的絕望！在絕境中再次抓住上帝的應許，竟然考獲了日本東京大學五年包食宿連機票的獎學金！不過最終因為父母不放心而被迫放棄，結果1983年與兩個女同學一起去多倫多，在York Herbert School 讀了半年Grade 13，之後有幸被York University 取錄了，歡天喜地之際，父母突然打長途電話來，告知輪候十多年的美國移民簽證終於批出了，要我立刻回港辦理手續，只好再次放棄自己本來的計劃。

世事難料，原來天父總有最好的安排！1984年來美後學會求問神的帶領，在Oakland的Mills College 同時主修 Child Development 和 Child Life Specialist，畢業後教書，結婚有小孩後選擇在家當全職媽媽，等到他們開始上學才逐漸恢復兼職工作。滿以為從此可以平淡安穩地過日子，但好景不常，2005年在夏威夷度假時因為呼吸困難差點要入醫院，回來看醫生被指為哮喘；幾番努力爭取才得以見肺專科醫生，2009年被誤診為肺氣腫，直到2015年才確診是患了「肺淋巴血管平滑肌瘤增生症」(Lymphangiomyomatosis) 簡稱為LAM, 一種極為罕見的肺病！目前仍未找到治療的方法，只是剛巧2015年才碰到一種抗排斥藥 (Sirolimus) 可以暫緩病情。而我也正好在這年被確診！一切都好像冥冥中早有安排。現在除了吃藥也需要用氧氣機幫助呼吸，但感謝神我還可以帶着氧氣機每天上班數小時！此外2018年無意中又發現有大腸癌，但天父保守，在我知道之前，早就安排醫生替我完全清除所有癌細胞！經歷這一切，深信父神必定會繼續拖着我的手帶領我前面的路，直到祂接我回天家！

The QESOSA Education Centre Elder Academy was established in 2007 with the support of QESOSA Secondary School (QOS). Teachers, students and parents of QOS as well as volunteers and staff from social service agencies participated actively to make the Elder Academy a success. 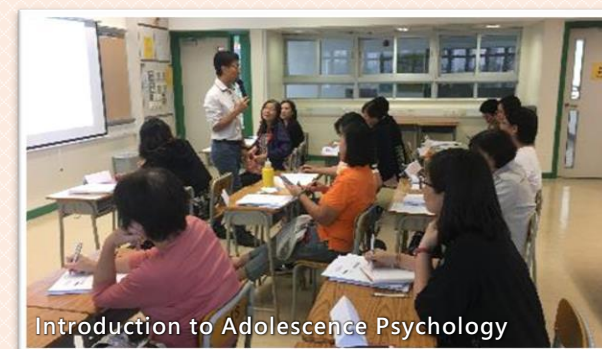

前言

學校秉承辦學團體的辦學願景，致力為學生營造「正面、積極、關懷」的學習環境，在學校設施配套、課程發展、品格塑造等方面更與日俱進，為培育21世紀的人才努力。過去一年，學校關注學生在課堂的多元化學習經歷及成就感，在培育學生方面引入正向教育元素，並優化STEM教育及電子學習在跨學科上的應用。以下是本年度的校務報告：

完善學校配套 促進互動教學

「工欲善其事，必先利其器」，為配合學習模式的轉變及課程發展，讓孩子在一個完善而合適的學習環境下發揮所長，學校作出了一系列設施上的更新。在電子學習的大趨勢下，網絡成為了資訊及學科知識傳遞的主要幹道。學校成功向優質教育基金申請撥款，於暑假期間完成全校鋪設光纖網絡，提高網絡傳送速度，並購置逾150台平板電腦供全校師生使用，讓推行電子學習方面更順利。

此外，在過去一年，學校已擴展至為二至六年級課室裝設最新款及更大尺寸屏幕的SmartTV，增加課堂師生的互動性，加強學生作品的展示度及參與度。在課程發展方面，為配合英文科Space Town的需要，學校把兩個特別室改裝成英文室，讓一至二年級學生每星期有多節在英語語境氛圍的課室中上課；學校亦重新設計七樓的多用途學習室用作發展STEM課程，學生在此可進行科學實驗探究、木工設計、編程，甚至不同主題的多元學習活動。

優化學習體驗 培養學習興趣

校舍設備的提升，為的是營造最佳的學與教環境。學與教是學校最重要的職能，是學校最基本、最核心的工作，因此亦是學校長期的核心發展項目。本年度，學校重點關注為學生提供多元化的學習經歷，提升學生在課堂的參與度及成就感。

為配合關注事項，本校繼續優化「體驗學習周」，為全校一至六年級學生設計四天的跨學科課程，提供豐富的體驗學習經歷，讓學生「走出課堂」。例如由學生外出參觀後，親自設計未來及理想公園藍圖、以環保物料設計手提袋、定立飼養倉鼠的計畫以認識生死教育等。除了「體驗學習周」之外，學校更把「體驗學習」的概念延伸至日常課堂，在逢星期一下午上課時段設立「體驗課」，由本校老師編寫教案，設計一系列的跨學科課程，例如一年級的生活技能課、三年級的游泳課、六年級的烹飪課等。體驗課的設立，能進一步豐富學生的學習經歷，並靈活運用全日制的上課時間，讓學生把上午時段的知識實踐至下午的體驗課中。

中文科於本年度重點提升學生的閱讀興趣，讓學生學會閱讀。在一至六年級推展必讀書計畫，配合電子平台、資料搜集及戲劇教育，教師以引領思維的教學模式教授學生必讀書的內容。活動結束後，學生仍會於早讀課及其他時間閱讀必讀書，學生亦因此培養了閱讀習慣，掌握了深入且有效閱讀的方法。

英文科一直致力為學生創造良好運用英語的語境，故設計了多元化的英文學習活動，包括English Fun Fair、Reading Buddies及World Book Day，讓學生走出課室，在輕鬆愉快的環境下學習英語，增加閱讀量，以提升學生的學習興趣。在過去一年，Space Town課程更擴展至二年級，課程包含唱遊、拼音、閱讀英文課外書及電子圖書等，以強化學生的英文語境。英文科更提升了學生展示自己匯報、英文作品的機會，結合電子學習平台，加強學生運用英語的成就感。

常識科：學生親身體驗光與影的課題，更具體地掌握光的特性。

數學科重點關注推行「電子教學」，在課堂中引入平板電腦及電子書進行教學，並運用不同的應用程式以豐富教學策略，教師亦能運用網上電子學習平台即時跟進學生的學習表現，準確作出回饋。數學科更讓每位學生因應個人能力，設立個人化的學習檔案，自行選擇程度合適的工作紙，或可進一步挑戰自己而選擇較高層次的題目，以鼓勵學生自學。

常識科重點在校本課程中加入STEM元素，引入mBot及Micro:bit編程課程，以培養學生的邏輯思維能力及解難能力。另外，配合各種與常識課題相關的小實驗，帶出公平測試及實驗的進行原則及步驟，以了解不同的科學原理，從收集及分析實驗數據中作出各種結論，培養探究精神。

培育正向品德 發揮性格強項

本校的「校本生命教育課程」已進入第四年，發展日趨成熟，與成長課及德育及公民教育課程更緊密結合。在過去一年，生命教育組更引入城大的正向教育研究室，把正向心理學的理論基礎引入，在生命教育課程中加入「PERMA幸福理論」

「24個性格強項」等。除了在各級的生命教育課程及成長課中加入正向心理學的元素外，更設計屬於伊小的24個性格強項吉祥物，透過校園氛圍及全校學生午會邀請教師分享，讓學生了解自己的性格強項；此外，亦配合學校全方位的大型活動，如在陸運會中加入不同的性格強項獎項。同時設立《伊正Super Kids》獎勵計畫，讓全校老師更具體及有系統地鼓勵學生發揮性格強項，進一步發揮正面的價值觀。

學校繼續推行「一人一服務」計畫，讓全校的高年級生均有貢獻自己的機會，進一步發揮「修己善群」的精神。本校更為全校的服務生提供領袖訓練計畫，建立學生的自信心、責任感和領導才能。本年度更優化了「好學生計畫」，以教育學生建立正確的公民價值觀及公正的投票態度。

展現多元智能 擴闊學生視野

除了學科知識的增長外，學校亦重視學生的不同學習經歷。為此，學校提供了多元化的延展活動。

學校致力為學生爭取更多境外交流的機會，擴闊眼界，以豐富學生的學習經歷。在2018-2019學年，學校舉辦了四川、河源及台南交流團，學生回校後與全體同學分享所見所聞所感，同學均津津樂道。

另外，學校於平日的課後時間、週末及長假期開辦不同類型的課餘興趣班，由專業導師執教。學生在整個小學階段均能參與五個不同範疇的活動，包括：文化藝術、康樂體育、社會服務/實踐、學術活動及生活技能。

在2018-2019學年，本校各科/組舉辦的延展活動合共超過100項，學生除了透過參加各種不同的延展活動外，學校更提供機會給學生參與不同類別的校外比賽，使學生寓比賽於學習，以自我提升的心態，延展所學。無論在參與人數和獲取的獎項方面均有理想的表現。

本年參與各項校外比賽的學生超過1500人次：學術類有581人次、藝術類有277人次、體育類有708人次。在各項比賽中，學生均有非常優秀的表現，獲獎的類別和數目如下：

學術類：冠軍5項、亞軍5項、季軍12項、其他192項
藝術類：冠軍32項、亞軍22項、季軍28項、其他58項
體育類：冠軍45項、亞軍54項、季軍36項、其他40項

學生在不同的範疇均有優秀的表現。在學術範疇以中文及數學表現最為優秀；在藝術範疇方面，舞蹈和音樂均獲得眾多獎項；而體育範疇的整體表現出色，其中足球、欖球、田徑、花式跳繩的表現最突出，多次在元朗區及全港性的校際比賽中獲取獎項，而欖球隊更獲邀請遠赴上海參加比賽，並取得佳績。

提升教師專業 加強教學效能

教師的教學質素直接成就學生的學習表現，要提升學與教的效能，首要考慮的就是教師的專業能力和水平。學校一直積極為教師提供持續專業進修的機會，建立優秀的教師團隊。

為配合關注事項，令正向教育於學校中得到更順利的推行，亦為了讓全體教師了解正向心理學及學習如何結合班級經營鼓勵學生發揮性格強項，學校邀請了香港城市大學正向教育研究室舉辦了共五場的教師工作坊，本校教師亦在平日的分享會及團隊經營活動中加入正向教育的元素。透過多方面支援，為教師提供新的教學點子及對課程作出反思。

而在學科方面，中文科參加由香港中文大學所主辦的「促進實踐社群以優化小班教學」支援計畫，重點發展小二的中文科課程，主要目的是透過多元化的學習活動，提高學生的參與度，以達致優化小班教學的作用。

在英文科方面，在過去一年繼續參與由教育局主辦的Literacy Programme，把Space Town課程的發展擴展至小一至小二的英文科課程。主要目的是透過自主學習及電子學習，以唱遊、拼音、閱讀英文課外書及電子圖書等課程，強化一至二年級學生的英文語境。

數學科參加由教育局統籌的「電子學習」交流小組，與其他友校教師建立學習圈，共同探究如何利用平板電腦及各種應用程式進行電子學習，運用手腦並用的方法，更有效建構完整的數學概念，計畫以優化五年級的課程為重點，並把相關的教學經驗及成果擴展至其他年級進行。

在常識科方面，五年級科任參加由教育局舉辦的「STEM活動初探」課程，與其他參與的學校完成共同集課及觀課，以研究如何在小學常識課程中融入STEM教學，增強課程中的STEM及編程的元素，培養學生的創意思維、解難能力。

家校攜手合作 孕育學生成長

學校與家長是教育孩子的好夥伴，所以本校一向重視家校合作。家教會於一九九三年成立，從當時的雛型發展至今天的成熟期，家教會已有非常精確嚴密的組織，家長與教師理事定期開會，為學校各方面的發展作出支援及協助。家教會亦會定期為會員舉辦各種親子講座、工作坊及康樂活動。家長樂意為學校所舉辦的活動擔任家長義工，如級本生命教育活動、體驗學習週、體驗課等，這些經歷都促進了學校與家長在培育孩子方面的交流，發揮家校合作的功能。截止至2019年6月中，共有172位家長曾經參加本校的義工工作，服務的人次有858人次，總時數達到2326小時。家校合作從二十多年前推展至今天的成就，實有賴各家長的付出與貢獻。

前言

作為學習型社群，學校不斷追求卓越。過去一年，學校在法團校董會的帶領、教職員的努力及家長的支持和信任下，協力為同學營造了一個正面、積極和關懷的學習環境。我們在學與教、延展課程、品德培育等方面均作出突破，且取得良好的成績，現簡略報告如下：

不一樣的學習，不一樣的成果

面對社會不斷轉變，未來人才必須具獨立思維、自主學習的能力，而知識、技能、態度同樣重要。因此，學校在原有基礎上，繼續以「培養學生自主學習能力」為主要發展項目，同時加強備課、觀課及議課文化，提升教師教學效能。我們與香港中文大學(中大)、香港教育大學(教大)及教育局合作，在不同科目銳意發展以學生為主導的上課模式—學生在家先作預習備課，回校後在課堂討論預習成果及困難，再透過多元化、生活化且活潑的學習活動，讓學生主動發現、探究問題，並以多發言、多發問及多反思的模式，令學習變得更有意思和有意義。

此外，我們舉辦了主題學習周，各級根據不同主題進行跨課程學習，讓學生透過閱讀和實際生活經歷，探討學習內容，解決生活問題。在綜合成果展中，我們喜見經過不一樣的學習經歷下，學生有了不一樣的改變—主動、喜愛學習、敢言、自信。而教師團隊敢於創新，備課認真充足，全情投入的態度，更獲得中大、教大和教育局一致讚許。家長們亦覺得學生比以前更愛談及學校生活，更主動表達意見。良好的學科基礎令本校同學在不同的校外比賽中獲得肯定，在中、英文及數理方面均奪得多個獎項。由於同學成績優異，表現出色，因此有一位同學在元朗鄉議局中學主辦的元朗區傑出小學生選舉中獲得十大傑出學生獎，更有一位同學獲元朗區校長會頒發傑出小學生獎。另外亦有多位同學獲得全港青少年進步獎等個人獎項，成績令人鼓舞。

悉力推廣閱讀，全校都是圖書館

要成為自主學習者，閱讀是重要的元素。因此，學校著力推廣閱讀，包括改革閱讀獎勵計畫，由重量改為重質，拋棄傳統的閱讀報告形式，改為著重閱讀分享。鑑於優質而具吸引力的讀物是閱讀的靈魂，因此教師組成購書團在香港書展以童心角度為學生購入童書，並放在課室內任同學自由取閱。我們更以「全校都是圖書館」的概念，在課室、走廊、校園四處安排漂書站和閱讀角，讓同學隨手可選擇不同的讀物，令同學閱讀興趣大增。

此外，各學科均於課程內滲入多元化的延伸閱讀篇章。英文科繼續透過Space Town讀寫計畫提升學生閱讀與寫作興趣，而中文科更發展出縱向校本童書閱讀課程，透過閱讀繪本、橋樑書和小說，有系統地培養學生深度和廣度的閱讀。結果，計畫十分成功，並獲教育局多次邀請向全港教師分享經驗。科主席及校長亦獲邀加入教育局不同的課程發展委員會為香港課程發展提供意見。

善用資訊科技工具，培育新一代人才

隨著社會急速發展，未來人才必須有良好的資訊素養—既能駕馭資訊科技工具，又能善用工具解決生活難題，在知識、技能和態度方面三者兼備。

去年開始，學校在小四全級推行BYOD「自攜裝置學習計畫」。同學們除了可應用iPad進行預習、課堂活動外，更可以即時進行評估，讓教師盡快了解個別學生的進度和程度，以便照顧個別差異。我們更為家長進行了五場公開課，讓家長了解孩子利用資訊科技工具上課的實況。觀課後，家長均表示同學上課非常投入，主動學習，又具分析和反思能力，課堂既有效率又充滿挑戰和趣味，家長均大感滿意。

除此之外，我們也積極推動STEM課程，在數學、常識、電腦三科課程內安排STEM活動和研習，培訓學生所需知識、技能和態度，並綜合運用，發揮創意，解決生活問題。例如：配合五年級的機械人和編程課程，主題學習周亦以「智能校園」為主題，全級同學走遍校園，找出有哪些地方可以利用科技設計幫助校長、老師與及工友解決工作上的難題。於是一個個有趣又實用的設計發明出現了：例如聰明停車場、智能健身室、自動送飯車及智能太陽傘等。同學互相介紹自己的發明理念、應用原理，並動手以電子積木、機械組件製作模型，又互相評價和修正設計，作出反思。過程反映同學如何透過STEM的知識和技能，發展駕馭科技的應有態度，甚至同理心。及後，我們邀請優異同學參加第一屆全港中小學STEM創科展覽及比賽，同學憑著對STEM設計的解說與反思勇奪全場亞軍，深獲評判和嘉賓讚賞。

培養正向性格，發展正向人生

很多現代人心靈越來越脆弱，情緒也變得負面，針對情意教育必須從生活點滴中培養，並貫徹「伊家人」以校為家的理念，學校推展了「My Class Home」班級經營計畫。班主任透過課室環境營造，進行多項創新的班本活動，凝聚班內氣氛，建立師生深厚情誼，加強了同學對學校及班級的歸屬感。我們更憑著此計畫，獲得「仁濟醫院德育及公民教育獎勵基金」獎項。

此外，學校與香港城市大學合作，加入正向教育元素，以24種正向性格為骨幹，重整各級成長課，令課程更有系統，活動更有趣，培育亦更聚焦。結果成效顯著，同學在認識自己的性格強項、自我欣賞和感恩方面都有明顯進步，也更認識自己的性格強項，在不同科目活動的反思中均能善用正向性格分析自己成敗關鍵。同時，對自己的性格強項更有自信，亦更認真面對自己的性格弱項，加以改善。

發展多元智能，發掘無限潛能

學校的延展課程目標是「擴闊視野，追求卓越」。為了讓不同能力的同學均有發展潛能、受訓及表演的機會，學校安排不同的同學參加各類型校隊訓練、擔任小司儀或導賞員，並在早會、綜合成果展及校園接待等活動中給同學鍛鍊的機會，培養他們在不同領域發展個人潛能，建立自信。

本年度全校學生共793位學生，但參加校外比賽共1,271人次，當中超過700人次獲獎。不少同學都是首次代表學校參賽，並且獲得獎項，而獎項涉及數學、音樂、視覺藝術及體育等多個範疇，對每位持分者都起了很大的鼓勵作用。

音樂藝術方面，伊分弦樂團表現日趨成熟，音樂科繼續於午間時段進行「午間樂陶陶」，讓師生有機會一同演奏樂曲，樂團成員又擔當小導師指導其他同學學習演奏樂器。此外，伊分弦樂團和合唱團經長期艱苦訓練，表現日見進步。在校際音樂節中，樂團獲得優良成績，而成立不足一年的合唱團更憑著高超的技巧，勇奪校際音樂節冠軍。視覺藝術方面，同學在多項全港性的填色、繪畫及創作比賽獲得多項獎項，贏得不少掌聲。

校園電視台發展相對成熟，發展方向亦由培訓拔尖小組參加比賽進而作普及性推廣，為有興趣的同學及家長開設訓練班。同學與家長的作品經評審後更可放上校園電視頻道對外分享。至今，電視台已有10個頻道，節目豐富，主題正面，創意與趣味並重。

體育方面，同學在足球、手球、舞蹈、跆拳道、武術、體操及游泳等項目上，獲多項冠、亞、季及團體大獎。在長跑、欖球、單車、辯論、機械人等項目亦取得突破性獎項，成績令人驚喜。由於同學於體育及藝術方面表現出色，多位同學獲得外間機構頒發獎學金，包括兩位同學獲栢立基爵士獎學金、四位同學獲王威信體學兼優獎勵計畫、一位同學當選元朗文藝之星、一位同學當選天水圍的孩子計畫的「自強孩子」、一位同學獲屈臣氏香港學生運動員獎等。

同學能在課外活動方面取得卓越成就，實有賴教師團隊的承擔與努力，家長們的鼎力支持，與及同學們的積極參與。

總結

「不一樣的學習，不一樣的成果」是學校本年度學習成果展的主題，也是實況。學校在良好和穩健的基礎上不斷突破，致力提升學與教的水平，又為學生提供全面的發展機會，培養學生成為自主、自信、具良好品德情意的少年。學校小一收生情況與家長口碑與日俱升，反映區內家長對學校的支持和信任。學校取得美滿成果，實在有賴法團校董會的支援，教師和職工團隊的努力和付出。我們期望在各方努力下，繼續打造高效的學習環境，讓同學可以感受到正面、積極、關懷的學校文化，並健康和愉快地成長。

QESOSA Secondary School 2018-2019 School Report

Ho Suk Yee, Principal

Staff Strength

Our school has a strong and professional teaching team. Among the teaching staff, 64% are higher degree holders and the remaining 36% are degree holders. More than 80% have over 10 years of teaching experience. All teachers have been professionally trained -- 16% have had training in Special Education; and all teachers of English Language and Putonghua have met the respective requirements of the Language Proficiency Assessment.

Public Examination Results

Student performance in the 2019 Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education (HKDSE) Examination was satisfactory. Among the 131 students who sat the Examination, 83.2% met the general requirements for sub-degree programmes (i.e. Level 2 in 5 subjects including Chinese Language and English Language) and 41.2% met the minimum entrance requirements for undergraduate programmes (i.e. Level 3 in 2 subjects and Level 2 in 2 subjects, or “3-3-2-2”, for the 4 core subjects). The average credit rate (i.e. attaining Level 4 or above) was 34.4%. There were 10 subjects with higher credit rate than the Hong Kong average; they included Mathematics (1 & 2), Liberal Studies, Economics, Geography, History, Tourism and Hospitality Studies, BAFS (Accounting stream), Information and Communication Technology (ICT) and Visual Arts. 39 students obtained 19 marks or above in their best five subjects. About 40% of our 2018-2019 graduates received offers of degree courses via Joint University Programmes Admissions System (JUPAS).

English Learning

English is a key learning area in our school. We aim to help students develop their language proficiency through a language-rich environment. Apart from the EDB Native-speaking English Teacher (NET), 2 more school-based NETs were recruited to bring in more English learning opportunities. Our students are provided with abundant opportunities to learn and practise English. English as medium of instruction (EMI) classes are offered in junior forms. Lesson time in English has increased progressively for subjects such as Science, Mathematics, Geography, Computer Literacy and Visual Arts. Our speech days, graduation ceremonies and sports days are conducted in English.

An overseas English study tour is organized every year. In 2018-2019, 20 S3 to S5 students spent a fruitful two weeks in Australia for language immersion and cultural exchange. A joint-school English Games Day involving the 4 EPO schools is a tradition of our English programme, in which S3 students of the 2 EPO secondary schools designed lively English games and set up game booths for our primary school students. We also worked with our primary schools to align the junior form curriculum. To increase students' exposure, all S4 students took part in the SCOLAR English Alliance “From Page to Stage” programme to have the English drama viewing experience. To promote reading, intensive and extensive reading schemes have been introduced. They incorporate regular reading and speaking lessons into the junior form curricula. All these are done in the hope that our students will become more confident in using English and enjoy their language learning experience.

School Activities to Broaden Students' Horizons

With the strong support from the QESOSA EPO, our school sponsoring body, and the networks we have established with different sectors of society, our students were able to break through geographical and cultural barriers to pursue learning opportunities in mainland China and overseas. In 2018-2019, cross-border learning activities included a cultural study tour to Kaiping and Dungen for the whole S2, a cultural exchange tour to our sister school in Beijing, a Geography and business study trip to Taiwan and an English study tour to Australia.

Awards

Our students continued to have remarkable performance in various open competitions. Academically, our students were awarded several First Class prizes in the Pan-Asia Pacific International Mathematics Invitation Competition and the Gold and Silver awards of Hong Kong & Macau Mathematical Olympiad Open Contest. Every year a group of S1 students and a group of S2 students take part in the Hong Kong Speech Festival Choral Speaking Mixed Voice competition. Our school has been awarded second prize in both the Chinese and English section?? in two consecutive years. In the science and technology domain, we were awarded the third prize in Hong Kong Inter-school Astronomical Competition and the overall Silver Medal in Drone Coding Competition/Hong Kong Inter-school Drone Coding Competition 2018.

In addition, we had a fruitful year in arts and music competitions. We won the Silver Award in the 47th Hong Kong Dance Competition and the First Category award in the 55th Hong Kong Schools Dance Festival. We were also awarded various titles in singing and piano playing in Hong Kong Music Festival.

In sports, our students were outstanding in territory-wide competitions and were granted opportunities to participate in international events in swimming, rugby and handball. Our school won various awards in rope-skipping competitions, Hong Kong inter-school football, volleyball competitions and a number of track and field events. Our boys (Grade B) achieved the overall champion in volleyball and football in Hong Kong Inter-school Sports Competitions (Yuen Long district).

Staff Strength

Our teaching staff consisted of 61 teachers, which is above the standard established staff number granted by the Education Bureau. 100% of the teachers employed have received their undergraduate degrees, 51% of them hold higher degrees, and 93% are professionally trained. Moreover, all English teachers have attained the language proficiency qualification as required by the Education Bureau.

Our Geography teacher was awarded with the Certificate of Merit of the Chief Executive’s Award for Teaching Excellence of 2018/2019.

Class Structure

There were four classes in each form from S1 to S6. To maximize the learning outcomes and increase the overall student performance, especially for students with learning challenges, small class teaching was implemented in junior forms. Under this arrangement, teachers were able to measure student performance more effectively, and tailor their teaching strategies to better cater for the diverse needs of students, thereby improving student achievement.

Student-centred Curriculum Support

The school adopted a whole school pastoral care policy, focusing on a school culture based on the values of respect and positivity. A dual class-teacher system was adopted to help students to have a balanced development in their academic and moral aspects. Motivational talks by teachers and students during morning assemblies and Personal, Social and Health Education lessons and cross subject curricula were employed to develop the students’ values and sense of citizenship. The school emphasized on the importance of balancing holistic physical and mental development, of learning diligently, and striving for excellence.

Every year, we will organize various study tours with the aim of broadening our students’ horizon. In 2018-2019, we arranged visits Shenzhen, Guangzhou, Xian, Taiwan, Japan and England.

The STEM workshops and competitions, career and life planning curriculum and education activities, summer internship, brass band and school team practices, were arranged for students to explore their interests and talents. We empower our students to unleash their potential to achieving fulfilling school lives.

We adopted a whole school approach to cater for learning diversity. We formulated comprehensive strategies, provided thorough support to students and applied timely evaluation. Remedial classes in Chinese, English and Mathematics were offered to S.1 and S.2 students; after-school language programmes for non-Chinese speaking students and students with special educational needs were arranged; career guidance and life planning programmes were run to guide students to make life plans to achieve their career goals; school-based speech therapy and professional assessments from educational psychologist were provided, and training in social skills and self-management skills were rendered. We hired additional teaching and ancillary staff including counsellors, assistant teachers and teaching assistants to make sure that our students at all academic levels could benefit from the above arrangements.

English Enrichment Initiatives

To help students develop their English language skills, the school undertook different measures to improve learning effectiveness and to encourage a passion for learning English. The school offered small class size to allow for greater interaction between students and teachers, and provided after school enhancement classes to support academically low achievers and to allow outstanding students an opportunity to develop good language skills.

In addition, we offered a wide range of English language activities and theme events, as well as competitions that took advantage of students' natural competitive spirit. These activities included cooking competition, fashion show, Through-train English Games Day, story-telling competition, debate competition, drama appreciation, Hong Kong Schools Speech Festival, Thursday vocabulary teaching, English phonetic course, debate course, fun English Society activities, creative writing workshops and overseas study tour. The in-class learning and the extracurricular activities served to complement each other and provide a rich English environment to enhance students' confidence and their proficiency in English.

2018-2019 Highlights and Achievements

Regarding the 2019 Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education Examination, the overall passing rate was 65%. We strive to provide an all-round education to our students and develop their potentials in different areas. In academic aspect, one S.4 student and two S.3 students got the second runner-up and merit awards respectively in the Chinese Essay Competitions. In debating, one S.4 student got the Best Performance Award in Mock Legislative Council Debate. Two S.4 students won the Best Debater Award and the Best Questioning Skill Award respectively in the Inter school Debate Competition. A total of 36 students took part in the 70th Hong Kong Speech Festival (English Speech). Two students were awarded the second place, 18 attained merits and 8 attained proficiency. In Mathematics, our students earned 5 credits, 17 merits and 4 certificates of honours in the University of New South Wales (Australia) Global International Competition and Assessment. In Physics, six S.6 students won a championship and a merit award in the Model Hovercraft Making Competition. Four students were awarded the certificate of merit and a prize for the creative design in the Drone Contest.

The Joint Schools Music Competition result was fruitful, with our students earning 4 gold, 8 silver and 7 bronze awards. The school choir and chorus group won the silver awards. The pop band and brass band won the bronze awards. One S.3 student won the championship in a guitar event of the Hong Kong Schools Music Festival. The brass band was awarded the championship in the district competition for 3 consecutive years. Eleven students were awarded the first runner-up in the Schools Dance Festival.

Our school teams performed well last year. Our boys' grade A football team was invited to join the Football Elite Competition for the second year and won the third runner-up in 2019. Our teams won championships in the areas of rugby and basketball. Five students earned the Most Valuable Team Members Awards in the rugby games. Finally, our school was presented with the Best Improving School Award for the girls' performance in Yuen Long.

Conclusion

Each and every student is special, with unique combinations of learning abilities and needs. Through whole-person education on moral, intellectual, physical, social and aesthetic aspects, we believe that every student has the potential to learn, grow and succeed.
